Read Letter from Anti-Vaccination League, dated 13th Nov 1911,

forwarding a copy of a resolution adopted by the league at a meeting held in Dublin on the 8th inst. calling upon the Galway Board of Guardians to respect the findings of the Royal Commission by refusing to prosecute parents who hold conscientious objections to vaccination like the Mums of Binnisortly, Gorey, Carrickmacross, Tralee, Rathdown & others. The Act of Parliament does not compel Guardians to prosecute parents, but it states, "the Guardians may prosecute, it does not say must. The League holds that Irishmen should have the same treatment as English, Scotch, & Welsh under these Acts.

Reports from Medical Officers re empties claimed to be outstanding by Messrs J. Clarke & Co late contractors for the supply of medicines, &c, now in liquidation.

Galway Nos 1 & 2 Disp. Dist. £3-13-5 claimed, M.O. states - there are no empties due.

Galway No 3. Disp. Dist. £0-2-1. claimed M.O. returned these empties since claim was made.

Moycullen Disp. Dist. £0-14-4. claimed, M.O. states all their empties have been returned.

Oranmore Disp. Dist. £1-4-11 claimed, M.O. states, empties have been returned regularly, what few remain will be returned if the firm send a suitable packing case.

Spiddab Disp. Dist. £8-9-11. claimed, M.O. states only a few bottles are due amounting to less than 2/-, about 2 years ago this firm sent a bill for £3 odd. I got the Porter to forward a large cask of empties, & I believe they tried to deny receiving them. I am anxious to keep my promise to the L.G.B. Medical Inspector, to have empties returned, but this is not in accordance with any rule or law governing the Medical Service, I will continue to do so but protest against any illegal threats from the Board of Guardians, the present contractors tried to deny the receipt of empties & do the Porter out of his just fees.

If this conduct is continued I must call for an inquiry so that the weight of these empties will be put on the right shoulders.

Wurloughmore Disp. Dist. £6-19-6 claimed, M.O. have 2 casks filled but as I saw by the Press that this Co became bankrupt - I did not know

what to do. All these casks cannot be filled back again so that the boys can have them back empty if they wish, but they should pay for carriage first instead of never paying. The charges for empties are too high, besides losses are bound to happen to men who do not reside in Dispensaries. The empties will be sent back when I resume duty.
