26th inst. Martin Keady, Workhouse Wardsman, left without leave at 2-10 pm, & returned at 6-10 pm.

30th inst. Nurse Quinn of the Fever Hospital left on vacation, & Nurse Kate Burke entered on her duties as substitute at £1-11-6 a week with rations.

2nd inst. Nurse Molloy of the Workhouse left on vacation, & Nurse Kathleen Murphy took up duty as her substitute at £1-5-0 a week with rations. No nurse in Galway being available I had to get this one from Dublin. Please examine 15 pairs new boots delivered by the contractor.

Wardsman Keady's Explanation.

The old man Patrick Toole is eccentric & feeble minded, on the night of the 22nd inst. when spoken to by me as to the state of his bed he seized his boot to strike me with it. I went to take the boot from him & in his attempt to hit me, instead he struck his own eye. I would be very sorry to injure or assault any man who is not responsible for his actions. Other inmates in the Ward can prove, if necessary, that I did not assault Toole.

There was only one tender for the supply of 6 Fireguards & 10 Kerbs for the Fever Hospital; M. Cloherty, 6 Fireguards at 3/- each, & 10 Kerbs, polished, at 2/- each.
Accepted.

The Clerk directed attention to the provisions of the National Health Insurance Act, in respect to the insurance of the Officers & employees of the Board of Guardians, & inquired whether the Guardians will make a claim for exemption. A general discussion ensued, but no definite conclusion was arrived at.

A deputation from the Women's National Health Association waited upon the Guardians for the purpose of pointing out that they have been informed that chronic cases of Phthisis are not considered suitable for detention in the Workhouse Hospital. Requesting that, under these circumstances, the Guardians will see their way to grant out door relief to the very poor who are so afflicted, to enable them to provide necessary nourishment.

The Guardians promised the members of the deputation that all such cases brought under their notice will, at all times, receive their careful consideration & attention.

A cordial vote of thanks to the deputationists for the service they render to a most unfortunate class of persons, was on the motion of Mr. McNeill, seconded by Mr. P. Gallagher, carried unanimously.

The Clerk directed attention to a clause inserted in the tender for the supply of 300 tons of coal & 100 tons of slack to the Workhouse, which tender was accepted at last Board meeting, as follows: "Subject to strikes & accidents." This clause escaped notice at the time, but ^{was} observed when the contract bond was being prepared.

The Guardians accepted the terms feeling confident that the contractor will deal fairly by them in the matter.

A Guardian having expressed a desire for particulars of the expenditure incurred in the improvements recently effected in the Galway & Rahoon Cemeteries, a statement of the receipts & expenditure in connection with these Cemeteries during the half-year ended the 31st March last, was read for the information of the Guardians. The Clerk explained that the Cemeteries are under the control of a Board of Management consisting of 10 members each from the Galway Rural & Urban District Councils.

The Guardians expressed pleasure at the great improvement in the appearance of these Cemeteries, admittedly due to the great interest taken in them by Mr. S. Fuller, a member of the Board of Management & also of this Board, & on the motion of Mr. M. Hooke, seconded by Mr. P. H. French, a cordial vote of thanks to Mr. Fuller was unanimously passed.
