He considered he was justified in issuing a red ticket on Dr. Glynn, Medical Officer of the Furlongmore Disp. Dist., for attendance on the child of Edmund Burke. In the event of an application being made for the cancelling of the ticket, he recommends the Guardians to favourably consider the case of the poor man. *No application to cancel this ticket is at present before the Guardians.*

Relieving Officer McNeill reported that Dr. Francis, Medical Officer of the Moycullen Disp. Dist., informed him of his inability to attend the Dispensary on the 20th inst., owing to the death of his brother. As there was no urgent case no other Medical Officer was called in.

In compliance with the request of the Guardians at last meeting, Mr. Jas. J. Reid, reported re the Boiler flue in the Fever Hospital as follows:

After a thorough examination I found although not defective in any way it is impossible without danger to the attendant to keep the larger boiler working owing to the excessive heat from the flue pipe which allows very little freedom in attending the boiler fire. I would recommend that the flue from the small boiler be led into the chimney which at present serves the large boiler, & vice versa, which would be the simplest & most effective way of overcoming the difficulty. A slight alteration of the safety valve of small boiler would be necessary in making this change. There is an insufficiency of light to read the thermometer.

Order. An extra light to be provided in the boiler house. Mr. Reid to be asked to furnish an estimate of cost of suggested alterations.
