24th July '13. From the Executive of the Town Council's League, Dublin, requesting the Board of Guardians to appoint two or more delegates to the Annual Convention to be held in Dublin on the 28th prox. The Chairman & Deputy Vice Chairman of the Board were appointed as delegates.

28th July '13. From Leonard, Park, Drumgriffin, complaining that his wife will not be allowed to any other than the Separation Ward in the Workhouse. Although unfortunate before her marriage with him, she should now be treated as a married woman & allowed into the usual place for her confinement which is pending, latterly she has been twice threatened with assault by an inmate of the Separation Ward.

An order has been made on the Punishment Book that this woman be prosecuted for insubordination.

29th July '13. From Mr. John Kelly of Lower Salt Hill, thanking the Guardians for their kind resolution of sympathy with him in the death of his wife.

30th July '13. From Miss Gore, Charge Nurse in the Fever Hospital, applying for the usual holidays.

Granted four weeks.

30th July '13. From Mr. J. Walsh, Relieving Officer in the Oranmore Disp. Dist., applying for four weeks' vacation, & stating that his wife Sarah Walsh
