There are also & paid attendants on lach Side.

Thy inspection was devoted to the Jemale words. all the words are well lighted and ventilated, The heating is Carried out by open fineplaces. The water Supply is good and the bothing and Santary arrangements Satisfactory. One wall Shows Signs of damp and Should be attended to. The Thous are old and Should be gradually renewed. the hedsteads are Satisfactory but the mattresses might be recovered. There is a Sufficient Supply of leven and blankets. There is no properly fitted operating room; any operations are at present done in the Surgery. Most Surgical Cases are Sent to the country Informary. The old dutary Scale is Still in Jorce, but I was informed by the master that the adoption of the new Scale is under Con--Sideration, and may be brought into operation with the new Contracts. The hours of Sleep you the night nucle are not fixed . On examining the beds with the Head Ninse I found two in a very dirty and neglected Condition. In one Case, that of a girl Suffering from a discharge from the leg, both Sheets were marked by the discharge and had a most offensive odour, and buildently had not been Changed Ja Some day. I Called the head nurse's attention to this and She fromised to remedy the matter at once. The other leed had disty Sheets and was Stuffed with the fratients Clothers.
