- 10th inst. Wardsmaid Delia Lydon left on a week's vacation. Her duties are being discharged by an inmate.
- " " Nurse Gore resumed duty in the Fever Hospital after vacation, & Nurse E. Keane, who acted as her substitute, left on same date.
- 13th " By direction of Dr. McDonogh I employed Bridget Lee as temporary wardsmaid in the Fever Hospital at 10/- a week with rations.
- 14th " The Rev. J. Berry, Protestant Chaplain resumed duty after vacation.
- 16th " Joseph Simon delivered 6 tables at the Workhouse, some of the eggs supplied during the week being bad were rejected & good ones were supplied instead.
- The milk contractors are not supplying a sufficient quantity, the usual substitutes have been procured.
- The contractor for bacon also was short in supply but he promised to deliver it today.

Workhouse Medical Officer.

I suspected Milk contractor Patrick Bodys's cow shed on the 16th inst. It continues to be ill ventilated & as he has not carried out my recommendations I cannot allow him to supply milk to the Workhouse. The Chairman undertook to accompany Dr. Mc

Donogh on a further inspection of the premises with a view to an arrangement being made satisfactory to all parties concerned.

The Workhouse Schoolmaster requisitioned Maps & Charts as those in use are very dilapidated & new ones were ordered.

Dr. M. McDonogh requisitioned a press for patients clothes in the Male Hospital Wards of the Workhouse, **Ordered.**
