Separation Ward. This building, in our opinion, is not at all so bad as we were led to believe by the report of the Inspector and the Medical Officers. The apartment appeared clean. The yard - which no doubt is a small one- should be concreted, as it is higher than the floor inside, which causes dampness. This work can be carried out by immates, if cement and sand is provided. If the inmates of this particular ward, get plenty of work in the line of washing and scrubbing through the Institution, they will want no further exercise.

We visited the Female and Children's Hospital Wards, also the Male and Female Infirm Wards. Each apartment appeared clean and comfortable.

Fever Hospital Grounds. The spaces not yet laid out, should be got ready for the sowing of Grass Seeds immediately. The Van Driver, when not otherwise employed, could be carting in road drift, for the hollows which are not yet quite filled in Workhouse Farm. No further Potatoes should be purchased, until the quantity at present growing on the Farm is exhausted. The Onions should be pulled next week.
