At the same time pointing out the urgent necessity of providing isolation wards somewhere, as in recent years, growing number of tubercular patients are crowded into the Workhouse Hospital, to the positive danger of patients,



Suffering from ordinary diseases. During the Year 1911, 15 cases died of Consumption, and 17 have already died of similar disease in current Year. But the very important matter of providing isolation wards, should not be undertaken in the off handed way the Insurance Commission would suggest, as, if such are provided, the Guardians must be prepared for an increasing demand for admission, when once it becomes known that the treatment of tubercular cases is carried on in the Workhouse. It would practically mean the establishment of another hospital, with sanitary accommodation and a special staff of nurses. It would be well, before proceeding further, to ascertain from the Insurance Committee, information as to what liability they mean the Guardians to incur, and what financial help they intend to give towards the project.

*Order. The Insurance Committee to be communicated with, as suggested by the Medical Officer.*

11<sup>th</sup> August.
