Board Letter No. 67939/15, dated 23rd Decr 1915, with accompanying copy of a communication from the Congested Districts Board, relative to the question of appointing a Midwife for the Island of Inishmore in the Galway No. 3 Disp. Dist. Consideration of this question has been deferred since the 29th Oct.

Resolved. That we beg to inform the L.G. Board that we cannot see our way to appoint a second midwife in this small Dispensary District.

D. Lynn, Medical Officer of the Turlingmore Disp. District, reported that he would gladly prosecute vaccination defaulters in his District only, his Dispensary Days fall on Monday & Friday which are Petty Sessions Court Days for Bradford, Berreen & Atheury, Not sure of Oranmore. Should the Dispensary Day at Curraundulla, Friday, be changed to Thursday, he might manage.

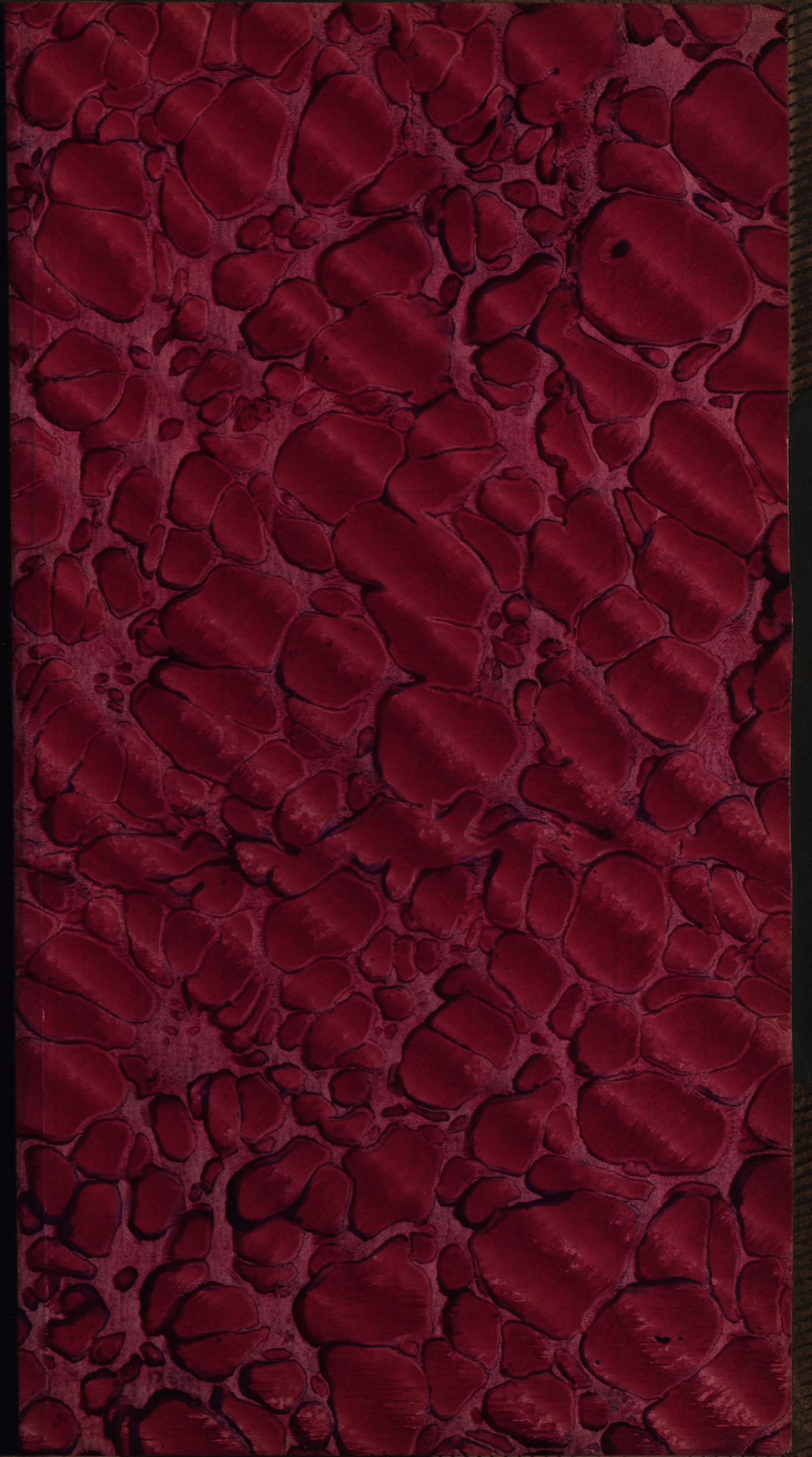
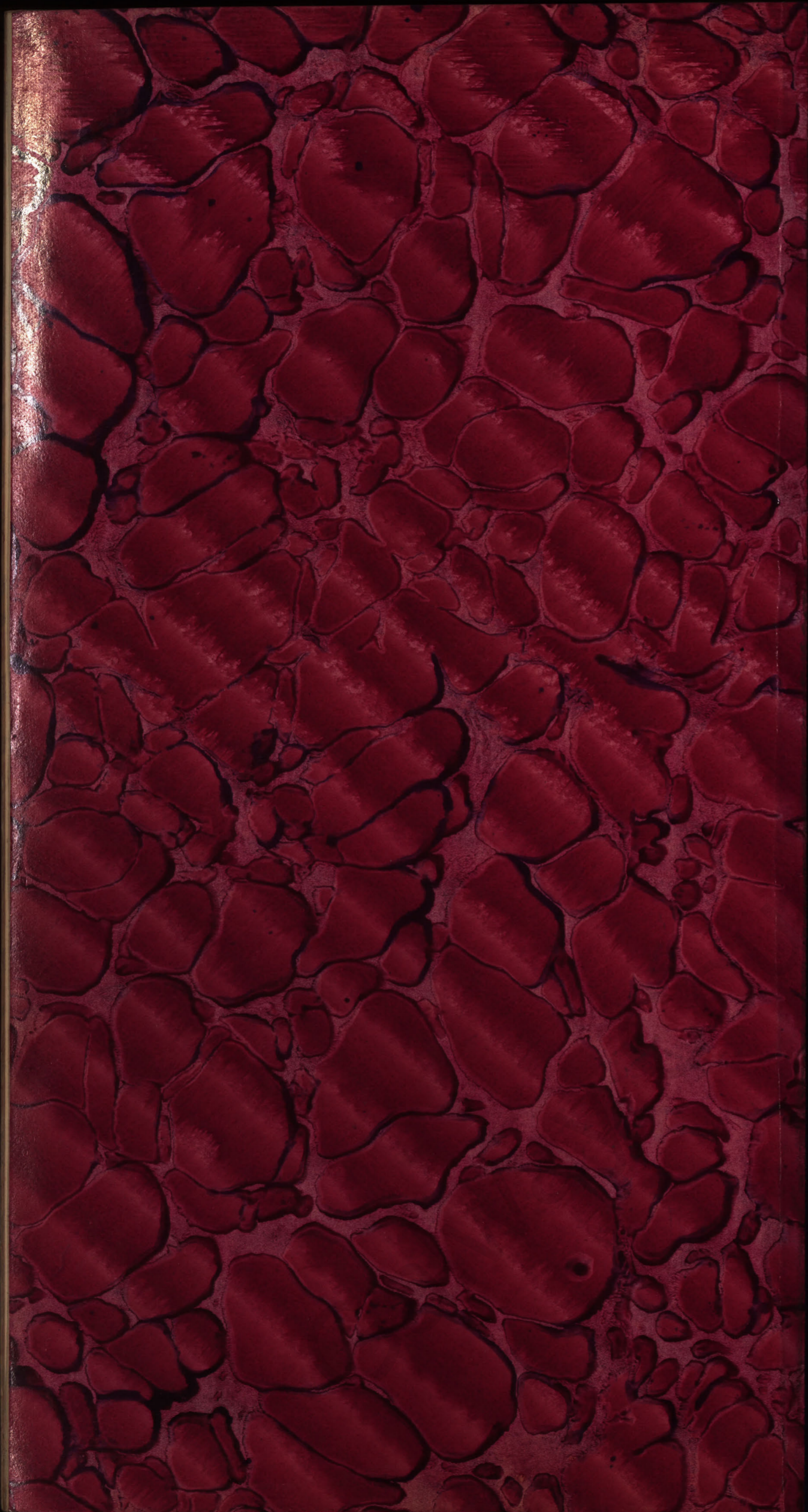

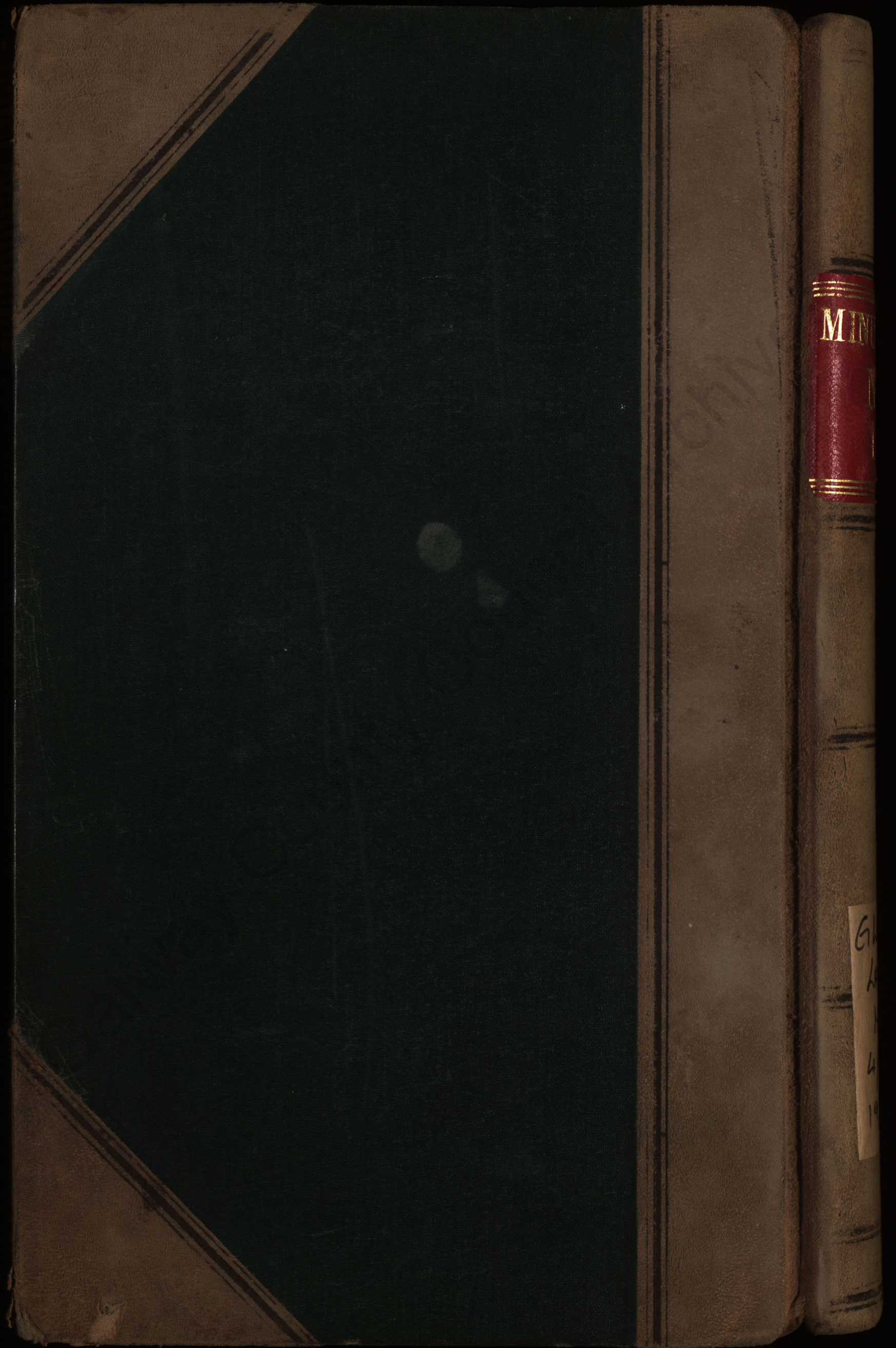
