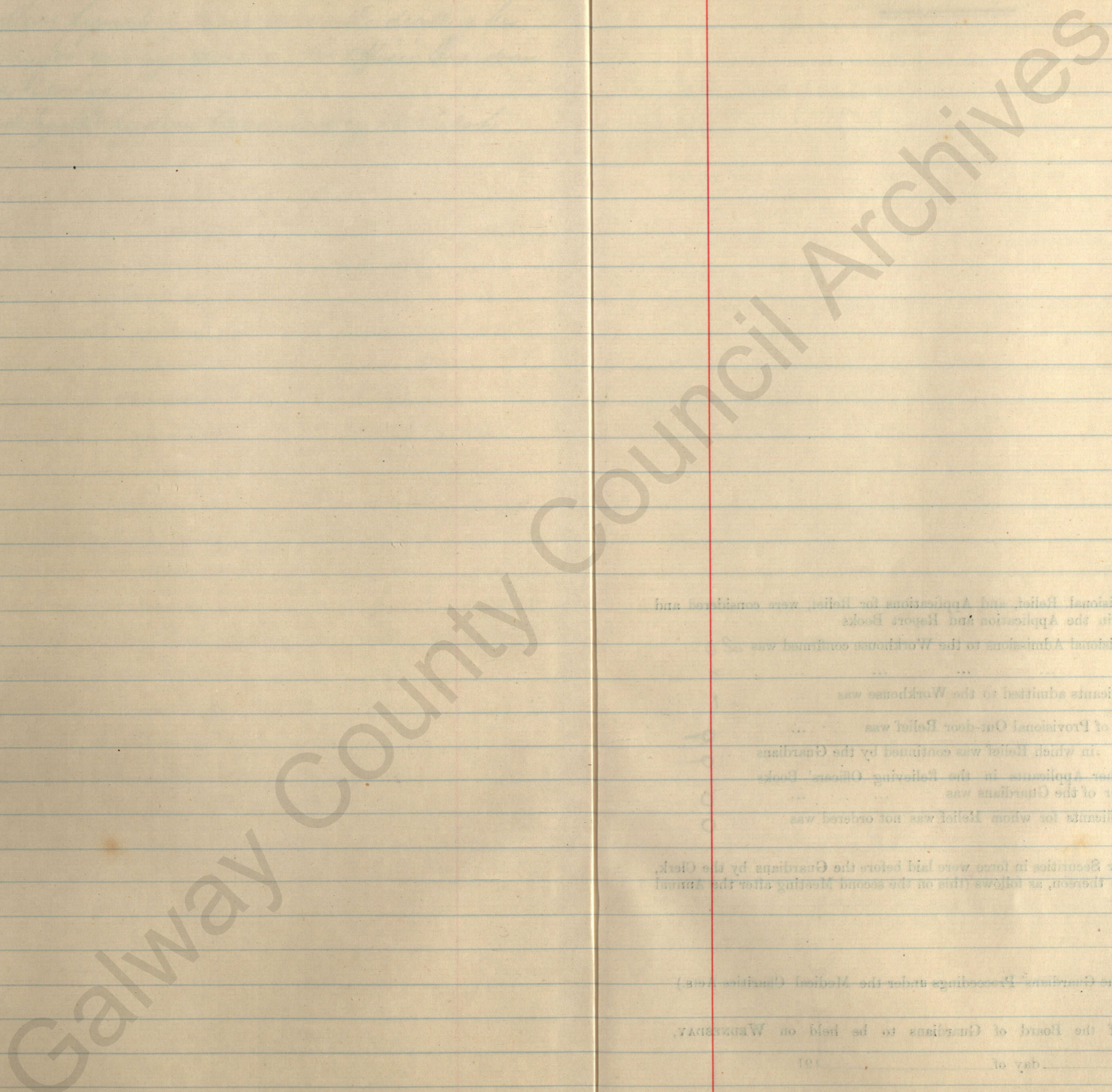

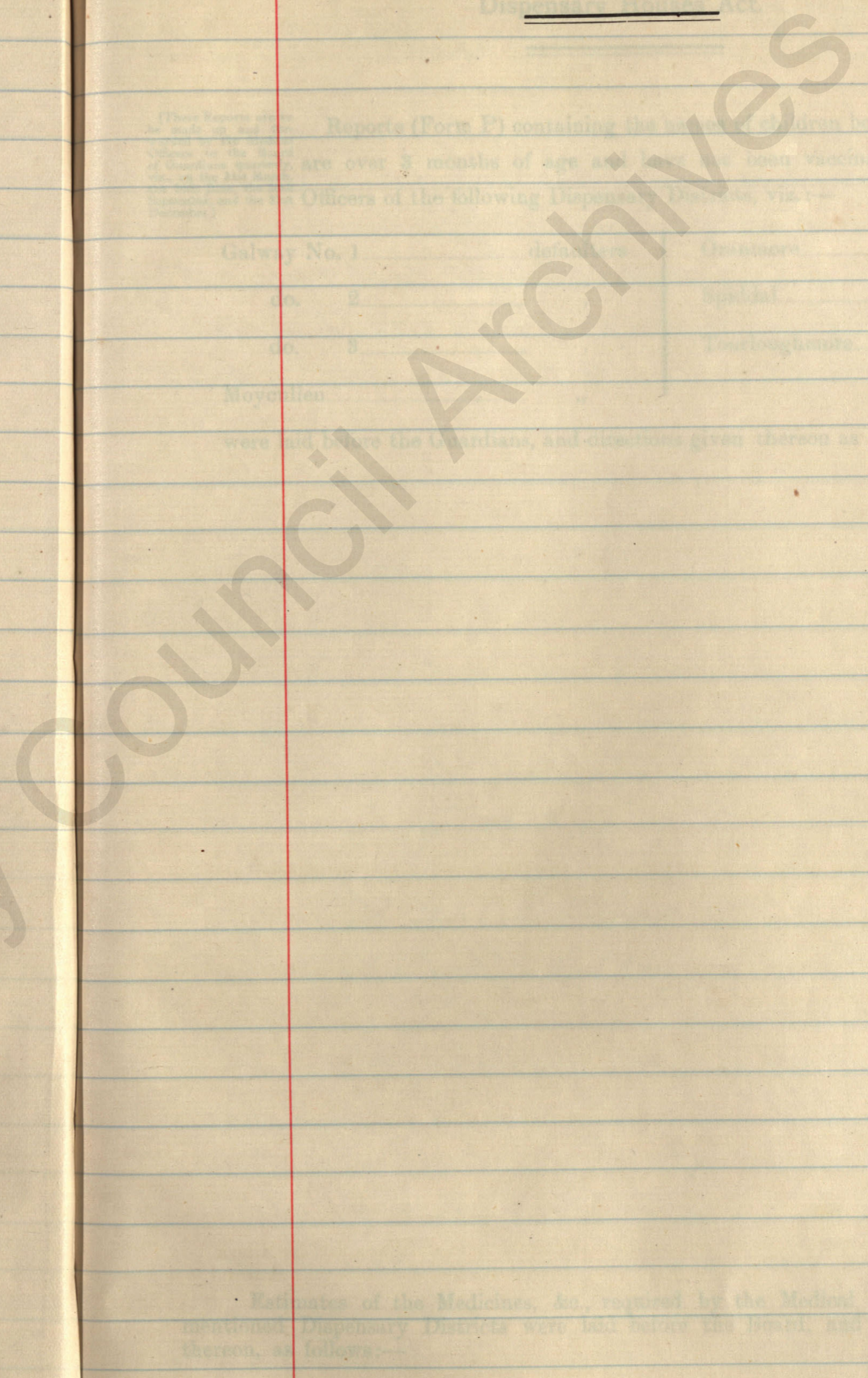

Read Letter from L.G.B. No 52135/16 dated 2<sup>nd</sup> Nov. 1916

*Vaccination*  
referring to the number of defaulters in the several Dispensary Districts of the Union as returned in the Medical Officers Forms L, for half year ended 30<sup>th</sup> Sept. last, & requesting that the Guardians will take steps to enforce strict compliance with the Vaccination Acts. The Guardians beg to state that as the weather is at present very inclement, they consider it would not be advisable to enforce strict compliance with the law.

7<sup>th</sup> Nov. } Approving of the arrangements made for the discharge of the duties of the Medical Officer of the Moyvelken Disp. Dist. during the absence of the Acting Officer on vacation for a week.

53,217/16.  
7<sup>th</sup> Nov. } Referring to the resolution of the Guardians of the 1<sup>st</sup> inst. proposing to pay a fee of £44-0 to Dr. Sandys for his services in assisting the Medical Officer of the Spiddal Disp. Dist. at a difficult midwifery case; & stating that payments for extra professional assistance should be in accordance with the approved scale of fees. If the Guardians consider that the existing scale does not afford sufficient remuneration for cases of the kind attended by Dr. Sandys, it is open to them to submit an amended scale for the Board's consideration & approval.

The Guardians beg to state in reply, that very rarely such assistance is requisitioned; that they

desire to treat every case on its merits, taking into consideration the distance travelled & the time occupied in the case. They consider the case referred to a very exceptional one, hence the exceptional fee proposed to be paid. Besides, at the present time, it is very difficult to obtain medical assistance. Should Dr. Sandys' claim be not in the manner proposed by the Guardians, legal proceedings will follow which will inevitably lead to further expense.
