They (*Mess^{rs} Holroyd & Son*) consider the Bill of costs in order.

Payment ordered, sanction of L.G.B. requested. Bill of costs accompanies copy of minutes.

The Relieving Officer for the *Burlingtonmore Disp. Dist.* reported that *M^{rs} Lynn*, Medical Officer, did not attend at *Burrauldulla Dispensary* on the *15th inst.* during the prescribed hours, but when returning home she met him on the road going there.

The Clerk reported having posted on the *9th inst.* a notice to each Guardian of the Union, a notice that a sworn inquiry into charges ^{preferred} against *M^r Lynn*, Medical Officer, was to be held on the *14th inst.* As the inquiry had been postponed until the *28th inst.* he awaited instructions to issue a second notice.

The Guardians do not consider it necessary to issue a second notice to them.

week.

32568/17. } Acknowledging the receipt of Clerk's letter of
26th Dec. } the 20th inst. applying for authority to issue
an Order under Section 13 of the L.S. Act, 1898,

to enable the Guardians to give outdoor relief to able-bodied persons in occupation of land who are alleged to be destitute.

The Board have had before them the list containing the names of the persons on whose behalf these applications have been made, & they can scarcely conceive it possible that the Guardians have examined the returns of the means of these people who are put forward as proper subjects for relief at the ratepayers' expense. All of them have land & cattle & sheep, & in some cases horses & pigs. Some of them have as many as six or seven head of cattle & twenty sheep. Pointing out that these are not persons for whom the section should be put in force; but if, on reconsidering the matter, the Guardians are satisfied that there are other cases without means of support for whom an Order is necessary, the Board will be prepared to issue an Order for a limited period.

The Guardians should clearly understand that the Board can hold out no hope of any Government subsidy towards this relief. The early potatoes will shortly be ready, & the usual resources of the people in the way of making & sale of turf will also be available. It is presumed that the cost of giving such relief as may be necessary between this & the harvest will not involve any undue charge on the ratepayers, especially as one-half of it will be spread over the County at large.

In the meantime if any exception destitution

arises the Relieving Officer can deal with it under Section 7.

The Guardians beg to observe that they have already informed the Board of the poor quality of the land in the district referred to as evidenced in the small Poor Law Valuation placed upon it. The stock of every description owned by these persons, as can readily be understood, are in wretchedly poor condition, thereby almost unsaleable. If they could be sold now it would be at a great sacrifice, & possibly they could never be replaced.

The Relieving Officer having afforded relief under Section 7 to several persons in occupation of land, & with one cow providing food in the way of milk, the Guardians have now made Orders for the admission to the Workhouse of these persons, which will cause the breaking up of many homes if they have to avail themselves of such orders. The Guardians throw the responsibility of this harsh measure on the L. S. Board.

Referring to an entry in the Minutes of the 20th inst. proposing to grant additional rations to the Cook, the Landress the Wardsmaids & the Wardsmen in the Workhouse, & stating that the revised scale of rations recently approved for these Officers is largely in excess of the standard which some of the best authorities consider sufficient for a working adult & the Wardsmaids' contention contained in their letter addressed to the Guardians on the 23rd inst. that "they are not able to do their work on

what they are allowed is untenable. In the circumstances the Board see no reason why any additions to the existing scale should be authorised. Adding that the weekly allowances of food set out in the approved scale can be so apportioned as to provide meat or eggs for the Officials in question at dinner on Wednesdays & Fridays.

Order. The Matter to be informed of the decision of the S. G. B. Moved by McBooke, seconded by Mc Murray, & Resolved - That we enter our strong protest against the action of the Board in curtailing the food allowance to Officials, allowances which we consider barely reasonable.

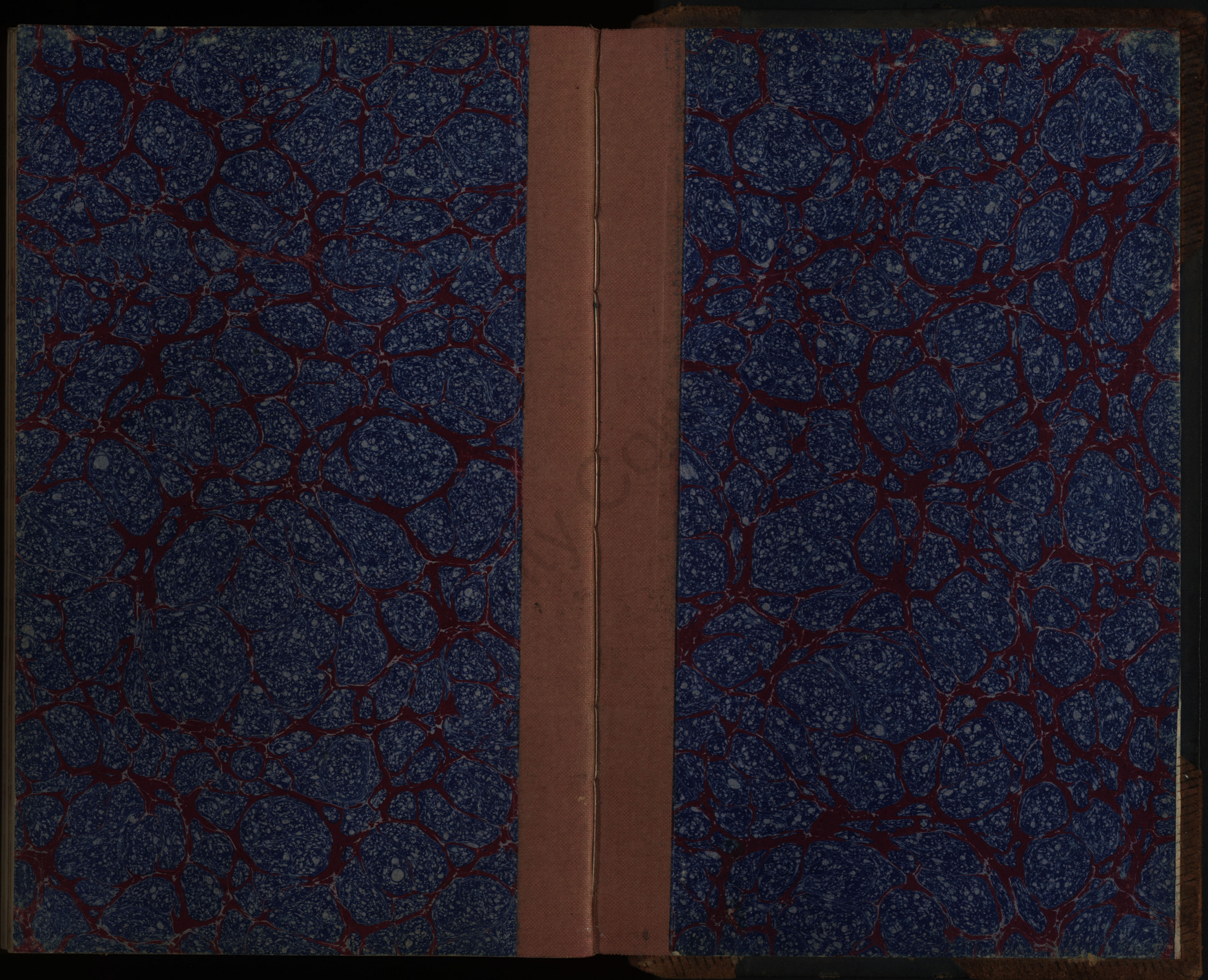

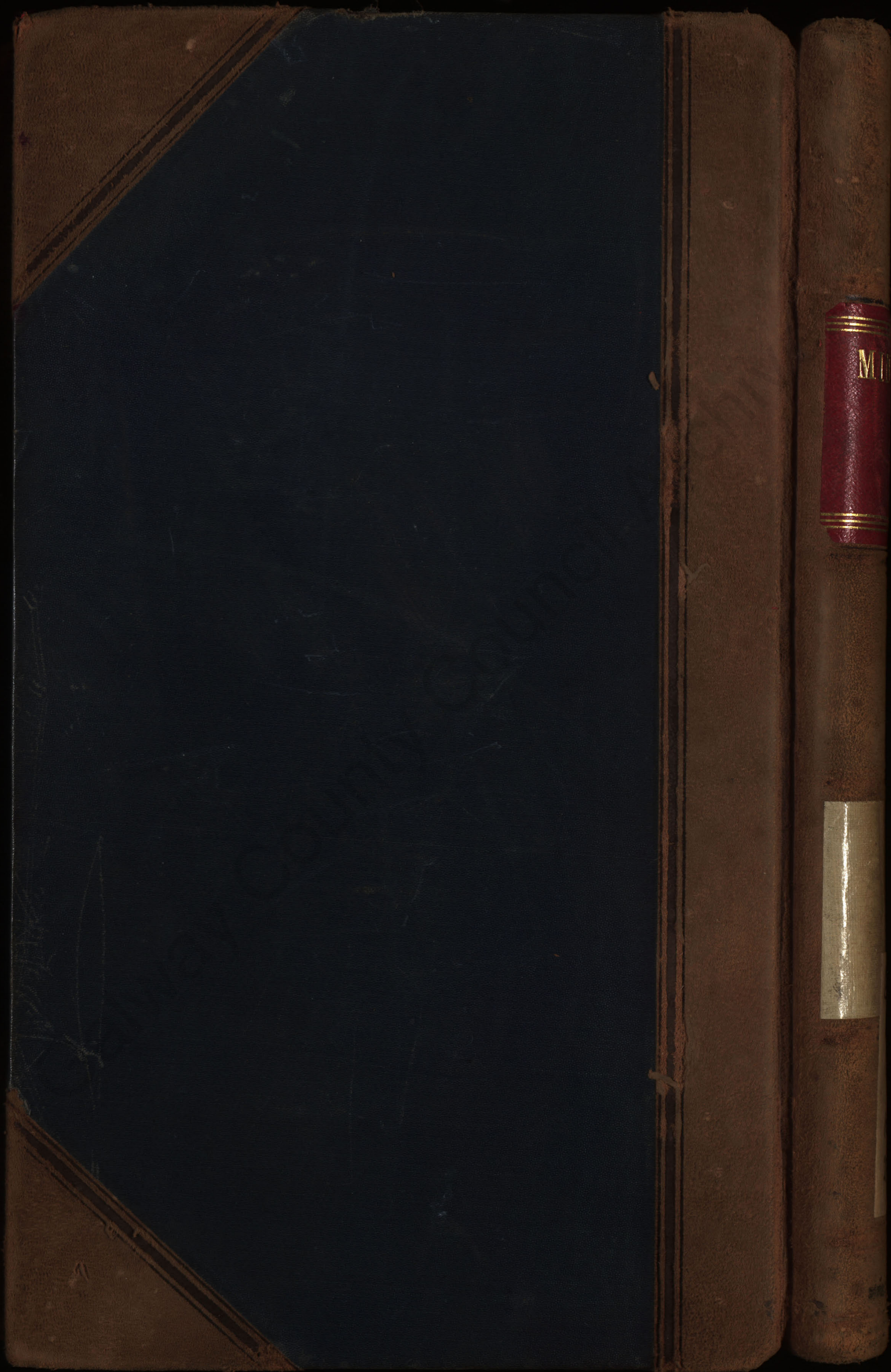
