 13th Dec? } an entry of the Board's Circular letter of the 24th idem respecting the urgent necessity for curtailment of food consumption; & to Guardians' order thereon, as to the relative costs of porridge & bread, the Board have to point out that the primary object in view is to conserve the supplies of those articles of food in which there is a shortage. The quantities of bread allowed to the Workhouse inmates under the existing dietary scales are largely in excess of the amounts which the Food Controller has repeatedly stated are permissible having regard to the supplies available; & the Board must, therefore, ask the Guardians to adopt the suggestions con-

-tained

tained in their circular letter above mentioned.

In the Master's Report the allowances weekly of bread to the different classes of inmates of the Workhouse are given. The Guardians are of opinion that these allowances do not admit of curtailment.
