The Reports of the Master and other Officers were read, and orders made thereon as follows:—

24th ult. Dr. M. McDonogh went on leave of absence & Dr. Waters took up duty as substitute.
 27th " On the recommendation of the Medical Officer a patient named Lawrence Holoney was transferred to the County Hospital for operative treatment.

Having regard to the urgent necessity of conserving the supplies of flour as conveyed in the L. G. B. letters, I am of opinion that it would be possible to reduce the allowance of bread by an ounce per meal per adult inmate. I am confident that the health of the inmates would not be affected. The Medical Officers approve of this reduction. I request instructions to carry out this arrangement.

Order. The bread allowance to be reduced by an ounce per meal per adult inmate, & a corresponding increase in the allowance of potatoes.

The Charge Nurse in the Fever Hospital applied for & was granted leave of absence for a few days, she undertaking to provide a substitute at her own expense.

 1st Jan'y 18 } Sanctioning the payment of commission at the rate of 10% to the Master of the Workhouse on all monies collected by him for repayment of relief, disinfecting charges, sale of pigs, old clothing & stores, & on the nett profit on the working of the farm. The allowance is sanctioned on the understanding that the calculations are to be subject to review by the Auditor, & the present allowance to the Master on the sale of pigs to be discontinued.

Contractors for the supply of margarine,
thanking the Clerk for furnishing them with a
copy of L. S. B. letter No 63112/17 dated 18th inst,
which in their opinion is the best & clearest expo-
sition of the Food Controller's Order they have yet seen,
the second grade which the Food Controller has
fixed at 10^d per lb. is the quality with which their
"Silver lining" brand complies, & they note that this
quality is what the Guardians desire to be supplied
to the Workhouse.

22nd Dec^r 17. From the Hon. Sec^y to the National Society for the
prevention of cruelty to children thanking the
Guardians for their contribution of £5 to the
funds of the Society.

Resolved. That we earnestly appeal to the Ad-

of four persons who lost their lives on the 17th ult.
the boat on which they were engaged in fishing in
the bay having been blown to atoms by the explo-

fishing net.

Already one family has been put on out-door
Poor law relief, the others are bound to follow soon
unless the Admiralty at once comes to their assist-
ance.

Mr. J. Lydon of Eyre Square, Galway, for some goods
supplied to the Board of Management of the

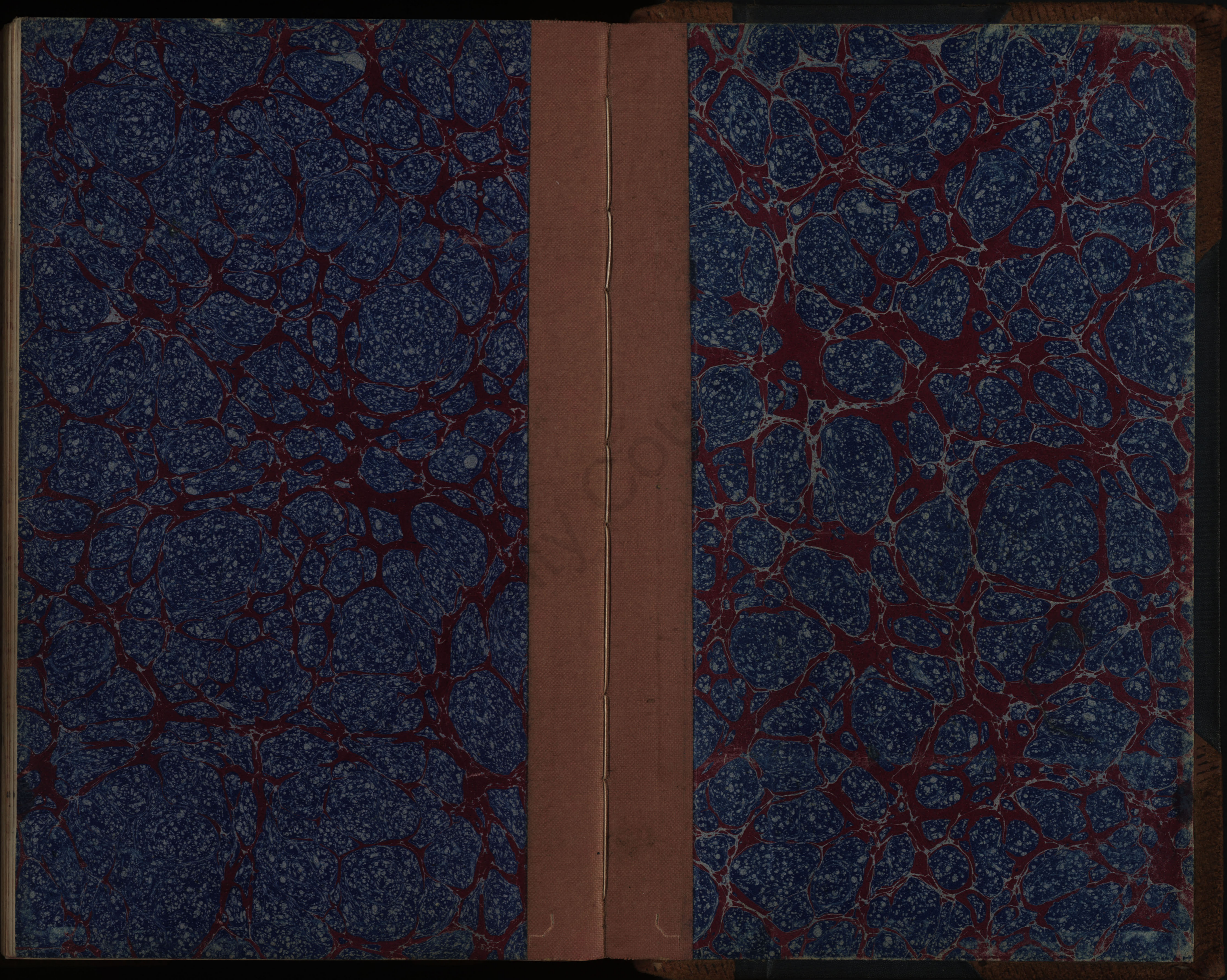

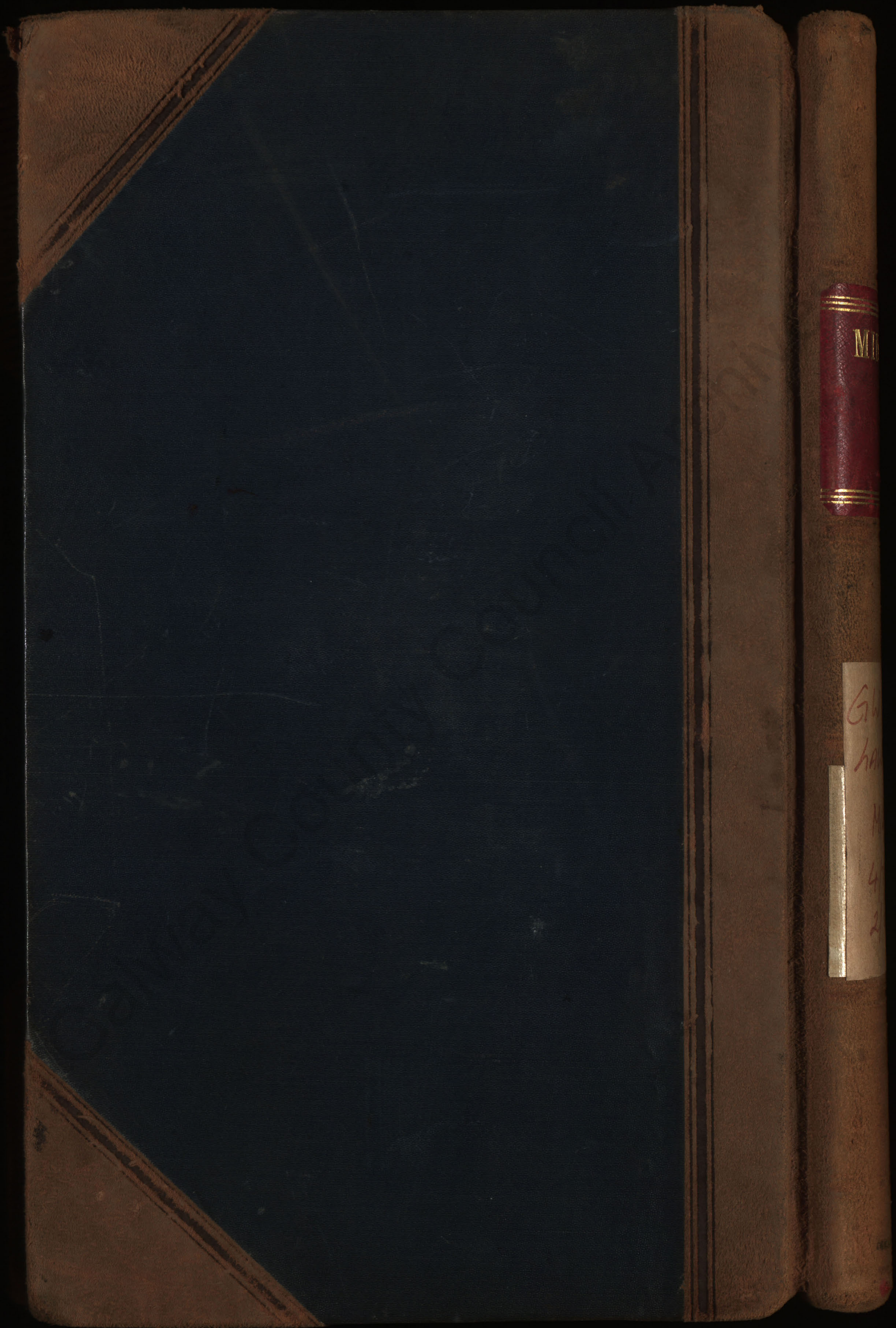
