Adding that the remuneration in this case appears very high, & the Board consider that the Guardians should be able to make satisfactory arrangements for the discharge of the duties on future occasions on more reasonable terms.

2nd Oct. } 26th Oct. relative to the contract for the supply of bread to the Workhouse for the ensuing six months; & stating that the Guardians must act on their own responsibility in the matter, subject of course, to review by the Auditor.

The Guardians consider the Board should give a definite reply. Having regard to the wording of the tender the contractors appear to be justified in claiming the extra price. The re-consideration of the matter by the L. S. B. is respectfully requested.

Copy of an entry made by the Auditor at the recent audit of the Union is: -

I hereby disallow & strike out of the foregoing &c as illegal the sum of $15\frac{1}{2}$ (portion of Pay order No. 219. 562. 18-11) & I surcharge with the said sum of $15\frac{1}{2}$ Messrs. W. Lydon, M. J. Cooke & J. J. Walsh, they being the Guardians who, by their signatures to the Treasurer's Advice Note of the 13th day of

December, 1916, authorised the payment of the said sum of $15\frac{1}{2}$, & I certify that the said sum of $15\frac{1}{2}$ to be due & payable by them, the said Messrs. W. Lydon, M. J. Cooke, & J. J. Walsh jointly & severally.

Reason. I cannot find any statutory authority for the payment which was in respect of refreshments supplied to the members of the St. Patrick's Band when entertaining the inmates of the Workhouse.

22nd Sept. 17. Resolution of the Guardians of the Rathfriland Union, protesting against the utter inadequacy of the recent supplemental estimate proposed by the Chief Secretary for Irish primary education; the financial treatment of Ireland in the matter of education is a grievous injustice, &c.

The adoption of this resolution was moved by Mr. Griffin, seconded by Mr. Lydon, & carried.

24th Sept. 17. From the Sec. to the Galway Urban Council, in reply to Clerk's inquiry, "the Council have not made any Bye-law re the prosecution of owners of dogs found worrying sheep." Moved by Mr. Lydon, seconded by Mr. Lawless, & Resolved. That having regard to the number of sheep recently killed by dogs in the vicinity of Galway, we request the Galway County & Urban Councils to adopt a Bye-law authorising the Police to destroy any dog found without a muzzle unless accompanied by owner.

29th Sept. '17. From Mr. Thomas Keane, re supply of sugar to the Workhouse, stating that he is aware that he should supply 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ cwt. monthly, that he supplied it until beginning of Sept. when his own supply was shortened. He expects a consignment next week when he will do his best to fulfil his responsibility.

In reply to Guardians inquiring re the supply of tea to the Workhouse, he cannot undertake the contract.

The Guardians consider Mess^{rs} Keane & Lydon are doing their best to supply their proportion of sugar having regard to the irregular deliveries to themselves.

Order. The issue of advertisement for the supply of tea to the Workhouse during the current half-year.

3rd Oct. '17. From Mr. M. Lydon, re supply of sugar to the Workhouse, stating that he is giving the best supply he can according as he has it in stock & will continue doing so.

As the L. S. B. are so exact about binding him under the contract for 1915, which was duly executed, they should sanction the payment to him by the County Hospital Board of the sum of £8 due since 1916. In this case there was no Bond signed owing to the uncertainty of the markets.

Resolved - That we request the L. S. B. to favourably consider the claim of Mr. Lydon in the matter of the amount of £8 referred to.

3rd Oct. '17. From Mr. P. O'Sullivan, Relieving Officer in the Galway District, applying for an increase in salary. This is his first application, although nearly 20 years in Office.

Mr. John Griffin gave notice that at meeting on the 17th inst. he or some Guardian on his behalf will move that Mr. O'Sullivan be granted an increase of salary.

No application received in response to advertisement for a Wardmaid in the Fever Hospital.

Order. The issue of advertisement, salary, &c. as before. Applications to be considered on the 17th inst.

Moved by Mr. Gallagher, seconded by Mr. Walsh, & Resolved - That we beg to tender to the family of the late Mr. Thomas Ashe our deep sympathy with them in their affliction.

That we express our horror & detestation at the barbarous treatment meted out to him in Mountjoy Prison, bringing him to an early grave.

The Clerk had to leave the meeting to attend at a Revision Court in Tralee.

Enclosing the substance of a report which the L. G. Board have received from their Inspector, Miss Browne, regarding the children boarded out by the Galway Guardians in Cleenamaddy Union.

18 children boarded out. The foster homes are satisfactory with the exception of one, & the child in this home is being removed to another home in a different district. The children appear to be very kindly treated, & well cared for; clothing very fair, & personal cleanliness satisfactory. School attendance on the whole regular, health good, & all appear to be well nourished. George McCabe is at present in Galway Infirmary undergoing treatment to his eyes.

Kate Connell has improved greatly in health. Mary K. Gore is now in an excellent home, she suffers from constant headaches which may be due to defective eyesight. I would recommend that she should be medically examined. Her clothing is insufficient as she has not had a new outfit for some considerable time.

There are 7 children hired out, in good homes, & are doing well & giving their employers satisfaction.

The Rev. Father Conway & the several members of the Ladies Boarding out Committee regularly visit the children & foster homes. They are to be congratulated upon the condition of the children in their care & upon the success

which the Boarding-out-system has had in this district mainly due to their efforts.
