*Granted.*

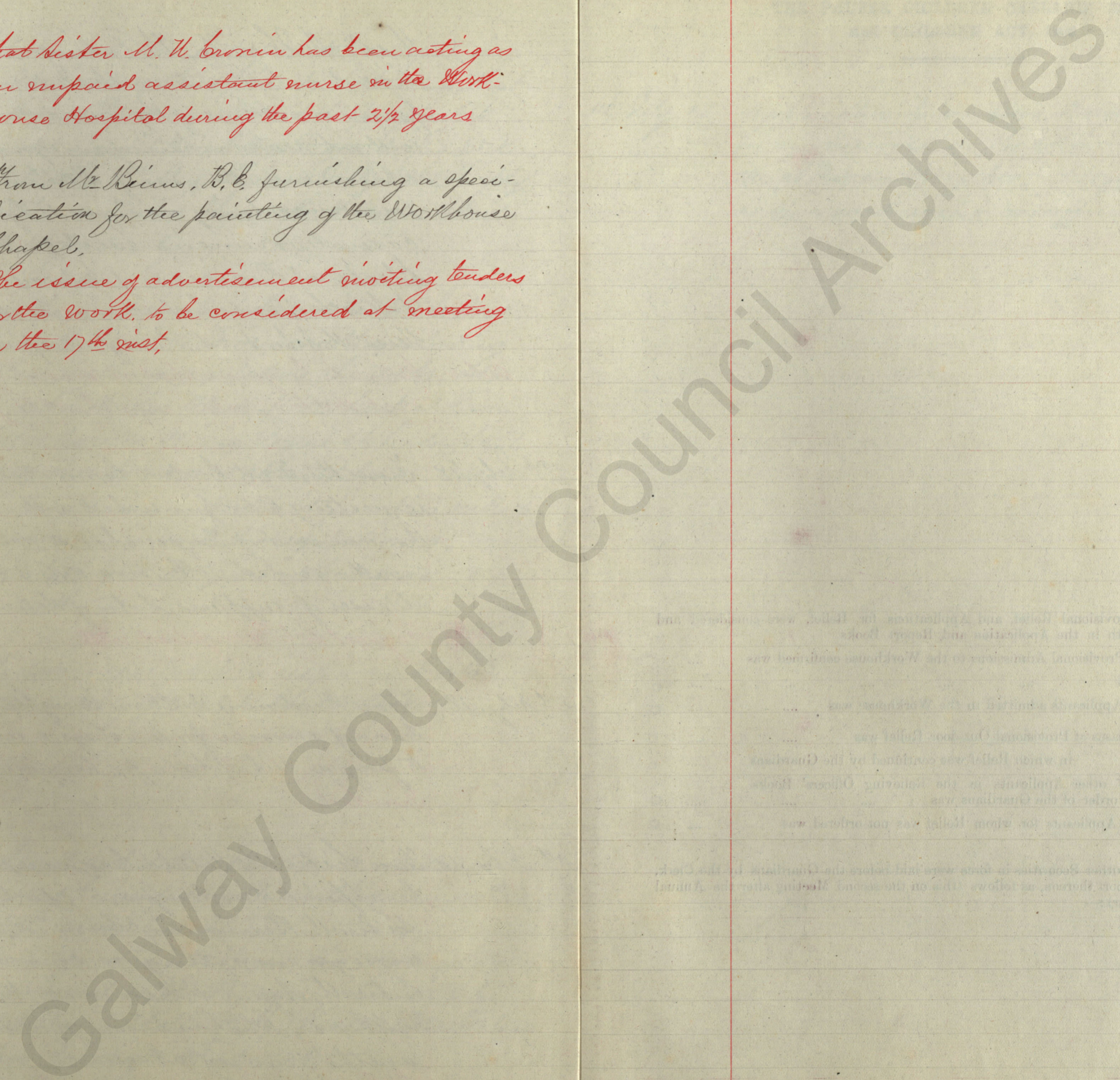
3<sup>rd</sup> July, '18. From Sister M. Ursula Cronin, applying to

2<sup>nd</sup> July '18 From Dr Samon, Medical Officer of the Oran-  
more Disp. Dist. stating that he found it necess-  
ary to have some repairs & shelves put up in the  
Dispensary for which he paid the sum of £1-12-0  
to a local carpenter. He supplied the timber.  
The lavatory is out of order.

*Required 2 or 3 basins of different sizes, a pail  
& a few towels for use in the Dispensary.*

*Order. A plumber to be sent to put the lavatory in order;  
the supply of basins, a pail & three towels.*

*Samon to be recouped £1-12-0, at the same  
time to be informed that it would be more regu-  
lar to report the requirement to the Guardians  
& leave it to them to arrange for necessary repairs.*

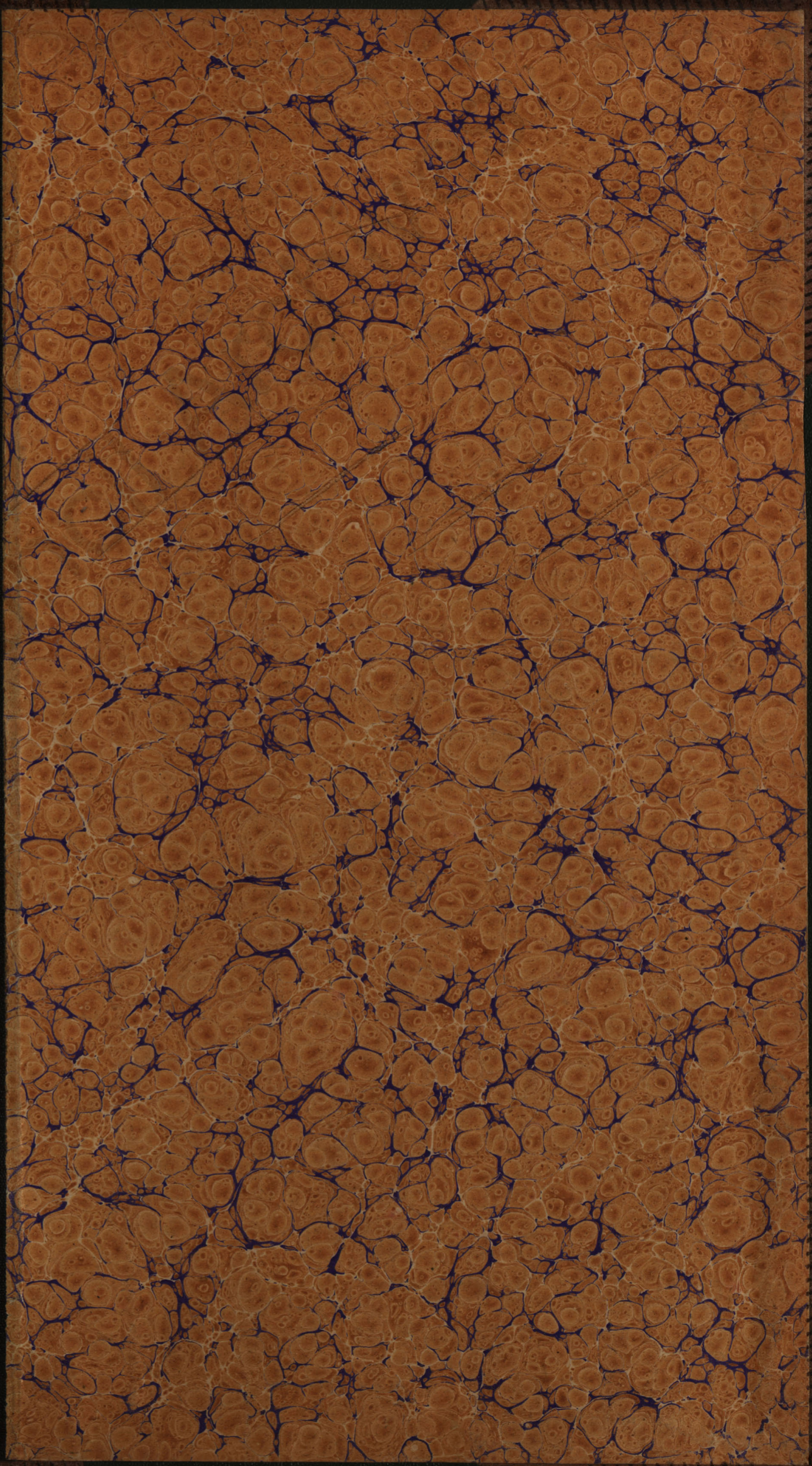
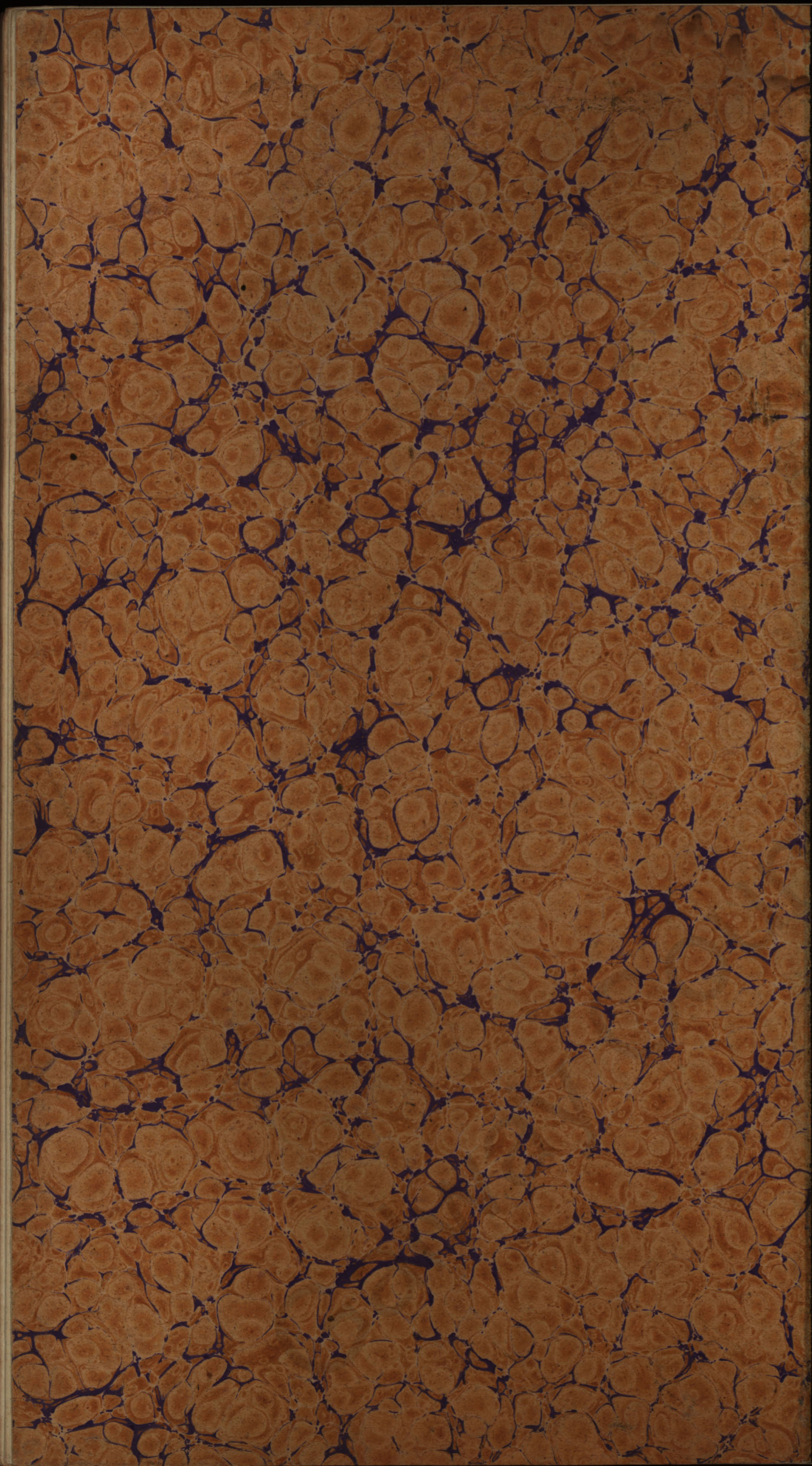
