The motion was declared carried.

Mr. Lydon further moved that Dr. Lammis's application for an increase of salary be considered. This motion was seconded by Mr. D. Moloney.
As in the case of the previous motion the same Guardians challenged a division which was taken & resulted in 26 votes being recorded for, & 8 against it.

The motion was declared carried.

Mr. Lydon then moved that Dr. Lammis's salary be increased from £120 to £150 a year.

This motion was seconded by Mr. M. Hoole.

Moved as an amendment by Mr. H. Blaney, &

seconded by the Chairman that the increase be to £140.

It was then agreed to take a division on whether the increase be £20 or £30 a year. Result, 24 votes were recorded for £30 & 14 for £20.

The motion to increase Dr. Lammis's salary by £30 a year was declared carried.
