Read Letter from *L.G.B. No. 44136/18*, dated *19<sup>th</sup> Sept.* 1918,

referring to previous correspondence in regard to the proposed employment of *D. Glynn* to discharge the duties of Medical Officer of the *Turloughmore Disp. Dist.* & stating that their Medical Inspector, *D. Clinch*, who has visited the District & made inquiries into the matter, reports that *D. Glynn's* services are not fully availed of by the poor of the District. As alternatives to the appointment of *D. Glynn*, *D. Clinch* suggests

- (a) That the Guardians should endeavour to get a temporary Medical Officer who would reside in the District, or
- (b) Employ *D. Waters* residing in *Salway*, or
- (c) Divide the District in two, placing the *Disp. Depot* & *Electoral Divisions* of *Bunaghdown*, *hiscanauan* & *Claregalway* in charge of *D. Golding* of *Headford*, & the *Turloughmore Dispensary* & the remaining *Electoral Divisions* in charge of *D. Hasty* of *Abbey*, or *D. Linnan* of *Atheary*, or *D. Cannon* of *Crannore*, whichever arrangement the Guardians considered most convenient & suitable.

The Board request that the Guardians will be good enough to convene a special meeting at an early date to consider these suggestions, & they desire to intimate that in view of the Inspector's Report & having regard to *D. Glynn's* previous record, they are not prepared to sanction his proposed temporary employment.

*ation. We recognise that a Resident Medical Officer is urgently required. The immediate release from Prison <sup>of D. Busack</sup> would supply the want.*
