- 26<sup>th</sup> inst. Maggie Grant, temporary Cook, &c. in the Fever Hospital left. On the recommendation of the Charge Nurse, Jane Lynskey was appointed temporary Cook at £20 a year with rations.
- " " Inmate Mary Costello was transferred to the District-Asylum.
- " " Ellen Naughton, Wardmaid, was admitted to Hospital as a patient.
- 27<sup>th</sup> " Thomas Dickin was appointed as temporary Wardsman at £12 a year with rations, & entered on his duties.
- 24<sup>th</sup> " An inmate named John Corneely, classed as a lunatic died in the House, the Police were communicated with, but the holding of an inquest was not considered necessary.
- 25<sup>th</sup> " The Food Inspector took samples of milk for analysis. Shortage in the supply of milk: substitutes consisting of Tea & Margarine were given to Hospital patients; & on one day, Eggs & Margarine to Healthy Inmates. Shortage, 11 gallons. The extra cost will be charged to the contractors.
