The Guardians are at liberty to place orders with any merchant in the Midland Area for such quantities as they may require. The Controller's

Regulation regarding coal being obtained from the same source as in 1917 has been rescinded, the only regulation at present existing is that coal must not be railed from one area to another.

place the matter in the hands of his solicitor.
He now declines to take the articles back.

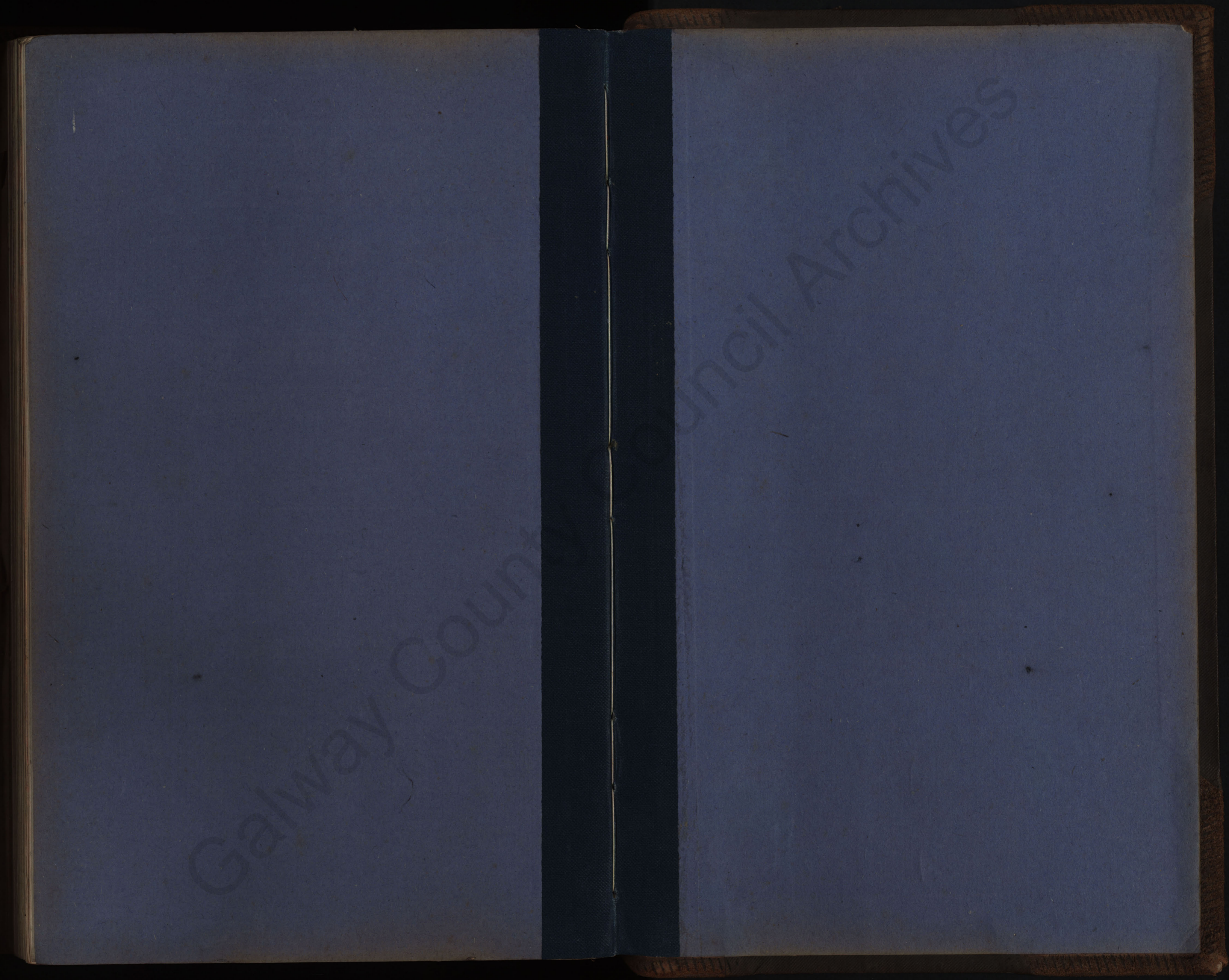

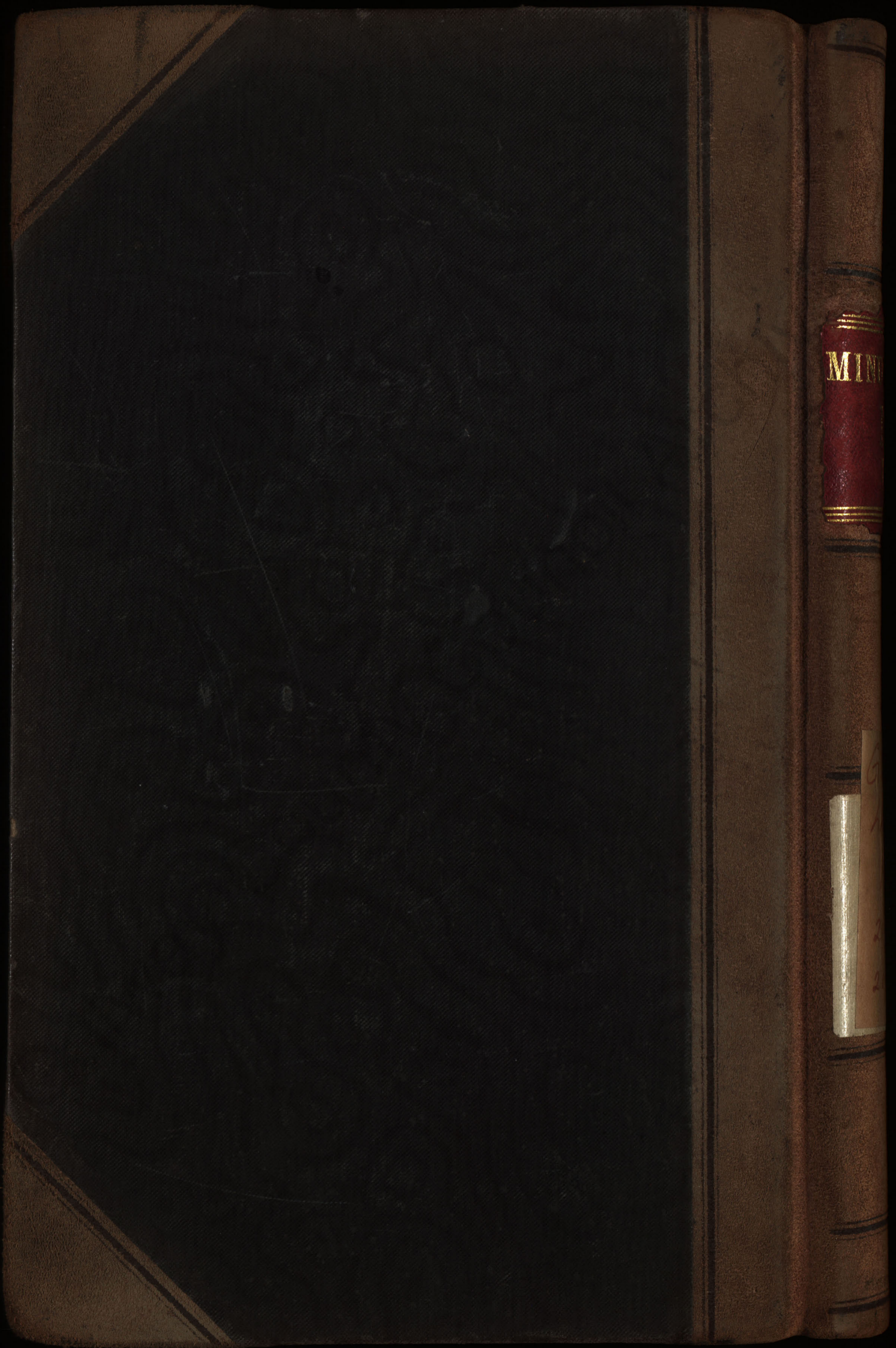
