- 19th Jan^y Nurse Annie Connor was admitted a patient to Hospital, On the recommendation of the Medical Officer, Nurse Sarah Hamilton was employed as substitute at a remuneration of £2.2.0 per week, and a weekly ration allowance of 5/6. *Approved.*
- 23rd " Wardsmaid Oloherly, recently resigned, left on expiration of month's notice.
- 24th " On the recommendation of the Medical Officer, patient Patrick Hanly was transferred to the Galway Hospital for operation
- 27th " Nora Smith gave birth to an illegitimate child in the Lying-in Hospital. She states the putative father is Sergeant Booth of the Border Regiment.
- 1st Feb. Nurse Quinn was discharged from Hospital, The Medical Officer states she will be unable to resume duty for another fortnight.
- 11th " Mr. John P. Fogarty, Fever Hospital Porter, resumed duty after illness
- 14th " Anne Drannion gave birth to an illegitimate child in the Lying-in Hospital. She states the putative father is James Rooney, a Rivetter, at present in Glasgow.
- 15th " Nurse Annie Connor resumed duty after sick leave of absence, and the services of her substitute, Nurse Hamilton, were dispensed with.
- There is a balance of £69.5.6 due for the maintenance of the late Messrs. Slaters Brothers. A Bill for this amount has been sent to the Solicitor for the Executors. *Approved.*

There are a number of old age Pensioners in the Hospital who decline to make any contribution towards cost of maintenance.
