3rd May, '90 From Dr. Duggan, Medical Officer of Loughmore Dispensary District, further reporting on the outbreak of Fever in his District. Of the two children of the Staunton family mentioned in last report, the eldest is up and well, but the youngest is not well yet. The nurse is keeping the house as clean and as well ventilated as possible. During the week he has attended two other cases of Fever, one a man named Tidy in Cortadoed who has since died, and the other Michael Hughes in Drumgriffin. He has been informed that both of them have had connection with the infected house at Lisheeran. The houses of Tidy and Hughes are in a perfectly sanitary condition. Hughes is in a very weak state, very prostrate, and totally unfit for removal to Hospital.

7th May, '90 Sanitary Sub Officer Cullinan reported having had all the clothing and bedding in the infected house at Lisheeran burnt, and replaced with other clothing and bedding at a cost of £12.17.1-
