Auditors Note.

I hereby surcharge against Relieving Officer John Martyn the sum of £2.6.0 expended by way of out door relief. I find several cases in which persons who were on relief in the previous half year have not only had the relief continued to them, but have also been relieved provisionally by the P.O. in the same week without any special reason having been assigned, and it is curious to notice that in nearly all these cases the Medical Certificates presented in support of the additional relief specify the cases as chronic. I further find that in some cases the amount of relief given was increased by the P.O. without any special intimation to the Guardians and consequently when signing the Book the Chairman would naturally be under the impression that the relief which he was authorizing the continuance of was at same rate as previously. I consequently disallow the following sums of relief given in the cases named.
