10<sup>th</sup> June, '90, From Dr. Duggan, Medical Officer of Lurlingmore Dispensary District, reporting that three cases of maculated fever have occurred in the village of Carranun. The first case occurred in the house of Andrew Gill of Carranun, whose wife has since succumbed to the malady, and whose son now lies ill of the same disease. Another woman named Catherine Tierney got attacked. She and young Gill are attended by nurses from the Workhouse. There is another case of fever in the adjoining village of Cossanun, in the house of Thomas Jordan. The disease has not arisen spontaneously in the locality, being in a very sanitary condition, but has been imported from the village of Cahererin, outside of Galway Union. A daughter of the late Mr. Gill residing in Cahererin being affected with fever died, and her mother brought home some of her clothing and washed them. She shortly after became affected with fever and died. All the houses in the village are clean, and I have exhorted them to keep away from the affected houses. The clothing of those affected ought to be burnt in due time.
