The Guardians at meeting on the 1<sup>st</sup> instant had before them a communication received from Dr. Kirwan on the same subject, and under the circumstances stated the Guardians thought fit to refund to Dr. Kirwan the £7.15.0 deducted from his salary, and at the same

time the Chairman of the Board informed Dr. Kirwan who was in attendance, that the deduction was made by an order of the Board, and that the imputation of a personal motive on the part of the Clerk was quite erroneous and should not have been made.

(1) The Clerk submitted for the information of the Guardians the Minutes of Proceedings at meeting held on 28<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1888, when it was arranged that the annual rent of the Dispensary Residence proposed to be erected at Craunmore, should be £19.10.0.

(2) A letter from Dr. W. P. Kirwan dated 5<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1888, in which he stated that he would occupy the Residence when habitable, and allow the Guardians to deduct £19.10.0 from his salary as annual rent therefor.

(3) A letter from the Local Government Board dated 7<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1888, in which they requested the Guardians to pass a resolution stating specifically the annual <sup>sum</sup> which <sup>they</sup> propose to ~~be~~ deduct from the salary of the Medical Officer as rent for the residence.

(4) The resolution of the Guardians passed at meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1888, fixing the rent at £19.10.0 per annum.

(5) A letter from the Local Government Board dated the 11<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1888, approving of the annual sum proposed to be deducted from the salary of the Medical Officer as rent for the residence.

The Guardians beg to state for the information of the Local Government Board that they condemn the conduct of Dr. Kirwan in writing such a letter to the Local Government Board, and that they place the fullest confidence in the Clerk of the Union, believing that there is not a more efficient public official in Ireland.
