23rd Dec. } (Ireland) Act, 1890, and the rules and regulations made in accordance with the provisions of the Act. Enclosing a copy of the Act, and a "Memorandum on Seed Potatoes."

The Clerk read a copy of the notice he sent to each member of the Board on the 24th instant, summoning a Special meeting for this date to take into consideration the question whether the occupiers of land in any Electoral Division or Divisions of the Union are generally unable through poverty and the failure of the Potato crop, to procure an adequate supply of Seed Potatoes.

Resolved. We the Board of Guardians of the Galway Union, do hereby resolve that we consider that the occupiers of land in all the Electoral Divisions of the Union are generally unable, through poverty and the extent of the failure of the potato crop, to procure an adequate supply of seed potatoes, and that we shall, at a meeting to be held on this day fortnight, apply to the Local Government Board for Ireland for a loan under the Seed ^{Potatoes} Supply (Ireland) Act, 1890, for the use of the several Electoral Divisions, the amount of the loan to be applied for, to be such as we shall determine at that meeting.

Ordered. Each Guardian to be asked to ascertain, and to be in a position to inform the Board at the Special Meeting to be held on this day fortnight, as to the quantity of Seed Potatoes required for the Electoral Division which he represents, and the variety most suitable for the land.

Ordered. Advertisement in "Freeman's Journal," "General Advertiser," and "Glasgow Herald," inviting tenders for the supply of the different varieties of Seed Potatoes.

On the motion of Mr. P. Scott, seconded by Mr. P. H. French, it was —

"Resolved. That we respectfully and strongly urge upon the Government to take into consideration the position of tenants who are not rated and where the owners or occupiers who have the land sub let, ^{to them} refuse to go security for the payment of

of the cost of seed; that there are very many of these under tenants in this Division and unless some provision be made to supply them with seed Potatoes they shall be deprived of the benefits of the Seed Potatoes Supply Act.

That a copy of this resolution be sent to the Chief Secretary."

30th Dec^r 90. From Mr. Joyce, Guardian for Lisecanawan C.D., stating that he will be unable to attend the special meeting today. If the Guardians can see their way to procure Seed Potatoes for the poor persons in the Division without any serious loss to the ratepayers, it will be of great service.

20th Dec^r 90. From the Commissioner of Valuation stating that in compliance with the request of the Guardians, he has extended the time for sending in Lists of Tenements requiring revision up to the 15th of March next.

31st Dec^r 90. From Relieving Officer Coleman, informing the Guardians that Mr. Patrick Silke, one of his Sureties, has left Galway, and submitting for approval of the Guardians the name of Mr. Francis McDonagh of Williamsgate St. as a substitute.
