I think it very hard of the Local Government Board to press me to go monthly to Galway when they always could see whenever I was called to attend that my books were square. I would think once in every two months would be often enough for any Rate Collector to go to Galway along with going twice or four times to South and Middle Islands. Perhaps the L. G. B. might get a Collector that would attend weekly and collect Rates with more satisfaction for them than I can.
