Permission was given for the placing of a head stone and curb stones at Grave Spaces Nos 3 and 4, Row IV, Section F, in Calvary Cemetery.

19th Jan'y 95 From Dr Biggs, Secretary to the Select Vestry of the Parish of St. Nicholas, Calvary, stating that at a meeting of the Vestry held on the 18th instant he was directed by a unanimous vote to call the attention of the Board of Guardians to the entire inadequacy of the portion allotted to Protestants, especially in the way of cheap grave spaces in the Cemetery at Bootermore; and further to request that a remedy may be found for this insufficiency either by increasing the accommodation there, or by providing a Cemetery for Protestants in some other convenient position. Also writing that as the matter is pressing, action may be taken with as little delay as possible.

Resolved - That in order to comply with the request of the Select Vestry, the 51 grave spaces in Rows III and IV, Section D, Protestant division of the Bootermore Cemetery, originally intended for free or pauper burials, be added to the purchase portion at a charge of $\frac{5}{8}$ for each grave space. In the remaining free plots there is ample provision for the interment of Protestant paupers for very many years to come.
