Reminding the Guardians that the second assessment must be made on the purchasers of seed under the Seed Potatoes Supply Acts at the same time as the next ordinary poor rate is made.

The Guardians beg to observe that they consider ~~that~~ the rates agreed upon will suffice to meet the expenditure of the Union for the period under estimate.

No. 37814/92 Referring to the report of the Medical Officer of Health of the Galway No. 3 Dispensary District on the subject of limewashing the houses in the Island of Arran, entered on Minutes of the 21st instant; the Board consider the report deserves the attention of the Sanitary Authority and they think every effort should be made to obtain lime for the use of the Islanders. If this cannot be done for the reasons pointed out by the Medical Officer of Health, the question arises whether fuel could be imported and the lime burnt on the Island.

The Guardians beg to observe that the Islanders have facility for procuring a supply of lime from Galway by the steamer plying between Galway and Arran Island twice a week, in addition to several sailing boats owned by the Islanders constantly plying in the same direction.

Order. Three or four defaulters under the Sanitary Act to be summoned to Petty Sessions Court if they do not comply with notice to abate nuisance.

No. 37814/92 Referring to the entry contained in the Minutes of the 21st instant relative to the proposal to provide a supply of water for the use of the inhabitants of the village of Killeany in the Arran Islands, and requesting to be informed whether it is the Guardians' intention to seek a loan of such sum as, with the contribution accepted from the Congested Districts Board, will enable them to carry out the proposed scheme.

Adding that the Sanitary Authority ought not to enter into any contract in respect of this work until the loan shall have been approved of and recommended.

Resolved - That we seek a loan of £250 which, with the contribution of a like sum accepted from the Congested Districts Board we consider will enable us to carry out the proposed scheme.

No. 37814/92 Referring to Minutes of the 21st instant containing an entry of a report furnished by the Committee appointed in connection with the possible introduction of Cholera into this country; forwarding a copy of plans, &c. for a hut hospital which may be useful to the Guardians and Mr. Burns, L.C. in considering the question of hospital accommodation, and stating that the Board agree in the views expressed by the Committee in their excellent report upon this subject.
