Cholera Regulations.

11th Oct. 1892. Letter from the Secretary to the Galway Harbour Commissioners stating that the Commissioners consider that it is unfortunate that the Guardians should not as the Coast Sanitary Authority take the very necessary precaution of having vessels arriving from infected ports boarded and inspected which the Harbour Board are not empowered to do. Suggesting that the Guardians should at once apply for leave to appoint the Harbour Master as Sanitary Officer under the Guardians at such reasonable remuneration as they think fit, which would enable him to receive and act upon their orders which the Harbour Board believe is essentially necessary as a precaution against a visitation of cholera.

Order - The Clerk to reply that the Guardians are of opinion that the appointment of the Harbour Master to the office of Sanitary Officer would not authorise him to board and detain vessels.

The Clerk informed the Guardians that in accordance with directions received from the Board at last meeting he had requested the Medical Officers of Health of Galway Nos 1 and 2 Dispensary Districts to report weekly to the Board on the ships inspected by them.
