The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland or others, relating to Sanitary Matters, were read, and directions given thereon as follows:—

13<sup>th</sup> June '92. From the Secretary, Congested Districts Board for Ireland, stating that the Board have, upon receipt of a memorial from the inhabitants of the village of Kilronan, Arran Islands, made inquiries through members of the Board and through Mr. Perry, County Surveyor, as to the nature of the water supply of that village. It appears that the existing supply is inadequate, having regard both to the sanitary requirements of the inhabitants and also to the necessity for a constant supply of fresh water in the event of the development of a fish-curing industry at Kilronan. With a view to making the latter contingency possible, the Board are willing to assist in providing a water supply for the village and also for the pier of Kilronan, and the Board offer to contribute one-third of the cost of such works provided that this proportion do not exceed a sum of two hundred and fifty pounds, and also provided that payment be deferred until the works have been carried out to the satisfaction of the Local Government Board.

15<sup>th</sup> June '92. Telegram from Parish Priest, Arran Island, requesting Guardians to expedite Government of Congested Districts Board, in procuring a most necessary water supply.
