Mr. Clements, L. J. Medical Inspector, placed before the Guardians all the facts of the case, explaining the present source of supply, its inadequacy to meet the ordinary requirements in dry weather, and pointed out the necessity for a constant supply of fresh water in the event of the development of a fish-curing industry at Kilronan.

On the motion of Mr. J. McDonagh, seconded by Mr. C. Burke, it was unanimously Resolved—That we respectfully request the Congested Districts Board to contribute one-half the cost of providing an adequate water supply, such contribution not to exceed £300. Also that we beg to

to be favoured with the Plan, Specification, and Estimate prepared for the Congested Districts Board by their Engineer.

That half this Special Expense be levied off the Townland of Killeany and the other half off the remaining Townlands comprising the Electoral Division of Inishmore

No 27449/92. 12<sup>th</sup> July. Acknowledging receipt of a resolution of the 6<sup>th</sup> instant relative to the area of charge proposed for the expenses to be incurred in providing a supply of water for the village of Kilronan in the Aran Islands; and with reference thereto the Board enclose a form of descriptive list respecting the area of charge together with a form in which application may be made for the loan which the Guardians desire to obtain for the purpose of carrying out the works in question. The Board desire at the same time to observe that the area of charge includes the three islands. With the information at present before them, the Board entertain some doubt as to whether the inhabitants of the two smaller islands (Inishmaan and Inisheer) would derive such material benefit from the proposed water supply as would justify the Guardians in taxing them for the works; the Board would be glad to be informed whether in determining the area of charge the Guardians had fully considered this point.

The Guardians in reply beg to state that this point was

was fully considered when fixing the area of charge. In the event of the development of a fish-curing industry at Kilronan, the inhabitants of the islands of Inisheer and Inishmaan would derive as much benefit from the water supply (without which the industry cannot be developed) - as the inhabitants of Inishmore in all respects, saving the supply for domestic purposes, which benefits the last mentioned only.
