29th May '93. From the Department of Science and Art, London, S.W., stating that the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education desire to include in the forthcoming Annual Report of the Department, accurate information of the extent to which local authorities in Ireland are forwarding science, Art, Technical, and Manual Instruction in their districts, and requesting to be furnished with particulars as to the action taken by the Galway Rural Sanitary Authority under the Technical Instruction Act, 1889, for the purpose of such instruction.
Referred to the Technical Education Committee.

29th May '93. From Mr. S. Crikerton, M.P. acknowledging the receipt of Mr. Clerk's letter of the 27th instant, forwarding a copy of a resolution of the Guardians, and stating that he is strongly of opinion that special and extraordinary expenses incurred in preventing the importation of cholera into the United Kingdom should be made an Imperial charge, and that no
extra

extra obligation should be placed on any particular ^{locality}. Promising to render every assistance in his power to give effect to the resolution of the Guardians on the subject.

30th May '93. Report from Dr. Duggan, Medical Officer of Health of the Surloughmore Dispensary District on the water supply to the village of Surloughmore. Referred to the Dispensary Committee of the District with a request that they will be good enough to favour the Guardians with their observations on the subject of the report.

The Workhouse Register was produced, examined, and authenticated, from No. 998, to No. 1032, both inclusive, by the signature of the Chairman and countersignature of the Clerk.

The Out-door Relief Register was produced, examined, and authenticated, from No. 8356 to No. 8356, both inclusive, by the signature of the Chairman and countersignature of the Clerk.

The Clerk's Report on the execution of the Orders previously made by the Board was read to the following effect:—

The Clerk referred the Guardians to his report to meeting on the 24th ultimo, relative to the failure of Rate Collector Hernon to attend for the purpose of having his Books examined since the 10th of March last; that he had complied with the order of the Board and called upon this collector to attend with his Books without further delay, but the collector has not since attended, nor has he furnished any explanation of his conduct whatsoever.

Order—The Sureties of this collector to be informed of his dereliction of duty, and of the fact that the period allowed him for his Rate Collection has expired, and that a sum of £200.9.1 is still outstanding.

The Clerk also informed the Guardians that he had communicated to Relieving Officer Tchernon the order of the Board at meeting on the 17th ultimo, that he should attend for the examination of his Books without delay, and regularly once a month thereafter, and that he has not since attended.

Order—To be informed that should he fail to comply with the order he shall be called upon to resign.

1st June 1893 Referring to the application to the Board of Works for a loan of £350 for waterworks at Kilronan, Inan Islands, and stating that the Local Government Board have received a communication from the Secretary in which he intimates that his Board desire to be informed in reference to this proposal what are the arrears of Poor Rate at present and whether any difficulty is experienced in collecting that rate. The Board request to be favoured with the observations of the Guardians on this subject for transmission to the Board of Works.

A sum of £200.9.1 of the current Poor Rate is still outstanding but this amount is likely to be lodged within a month from this date. There is none other than the ordinary difficulty experienced in collecting rates on Inan Islands. The rate is paid in full each year.

6th June 93 Letter from Mr. M. Tidy, Guardian for Stradbally B.D. informing the Guardians that the new well at Caldwell is almost dry, there being only about

about six inches of water in it at present. Stating that the contractor seems to think he has finished his contract, and suggesting a visit from the Engineer before a final payment be made.

The Engineer, who was in attendance, informed the Guardians that the contract has not been completed. If necessary a further excavation can be made.

Sanitary Sub-officer Phullinan informed the Guardians that it was the wish of the Local Guardian and some of the ratepayers that the Engineer be directed to prepare a specification of the work of fencing the Wells at Carnam and Turloughmore common.
