The Board note that the application is for £250 and  
the estimate for works £500, and though a con-  
-tribution of £250 is to be given by the Congested  
Districts Board, it is a question whether it would  
not be better to increase the amount of the loan  
now applied for.

13<sup>th</sup> Dec. 92. Letter from Mr. J. R. M. Crozier, Solicitor to the owners  
of Arran Island estate, stating that he has seen Mr.  
Wicks the Secretary of the Congested Districts Board who

informed him that the Guardians are under a  
misapprehension if they believe that an adequate  
supply of water is required to enable a fish curing  
industry to be carried on at the village and pier.  
The fresh water would, no doubt, be used by those  
working at fish curing, but sea water would be  
used for the purposes of the industry. When the subject  
of contributing to the expense of bringing the water  
there was before the Congested Districts Board, their  
attention had not been called to the fact that  
almost the entire Poor Rates on the Islands are paid  
by the owners, and that a very large number of the  
tenants were not paying their rents, and conse-  
-quently it would be a hardship on the owners to  
have to meet increased taxation with a consider-  
-ably reduced income. That he (Mr. Crozier) purposes  
asking the Congested Districts Board to reconsider  
the subject with the additional facts before them and  
to increase their contribution accordingly. That  
when he receives their reply he will bring the subject  
under the attention of the owners, and meantime he  
would ask the Guardians not to take any action in the  
matter.

-mediate action in the matter.*

16<sup>th</sup> Dec. 92. Letter from the Rev. P. J. McSheehy, P.P. Arran Island,  
stating that the proposed water supply will be of the
