The following resolution having been proposed by Mr. J. J. Kirwan, and seconded by Mr. D. Harrington, was carried unanimously.

Resolved. That we willingly and earnestly co-operate with the other Local Boards of our City in most respectfully calling upon the Lords of the Treasury to wipe out the debt at present existing on our Harbour, which debt had been incurred as much through the oversight of the Board of Works and the Engineers connected with that Department as by the fact that the loan for such purpose - that of constructing a deep water Dock which is utterly useless for the purpose for which it was intended - was agreed to be applied for by the mere casting vote of the Chairman of the Harbour Commissioners.

The Clerk informed the Guardians that Rate collector Hernon has not attended for the examination of his accounts since the 25<sup>th</sup> of August last. On that date his accounts showed a sum of £11.5.5 collected since his previous lodgment of rates, but he lodged only £10.5.5 retaining a sum of £1.0.0 on hands which has not since been lodged. The time allowed him for the completion of his collection expired on the 7<sup>th</sup> of June last, but there is still a sum of
