15th June '93. R. Cameron's report of analysis of sample of water taken from Coldwood Well.

" This water had an odour and flavour of Camphor
 " no doubt from the circumstance that a Camphor
 " preparation was in the vessel previously. It was
 " fermented with pure sugar for a week at a
 " temperature of 80°F. It became turbid. Under
 " similar conditions bad waters become turbid from
 " development of fungi (moulds) from spores and
 " good waters remain quite clear. The water now
 " being reported on contains a rather large number
 " of micro-organisms. The amounts of saline
 " and albuminoid ammonia are rather larger than
 " are found in first class waters. On the whole this is
 " a second class water, not decidedly bad, but not a
 " desirable one to drink."
