Read Letter from Board of Works dated 6th September, stating that, Referring to previous correspondence relative to a supplemental ^{loan} in respect of the Oranmore Dispensary Buildings, the Board observe that the original loan made in 1889 of £550 included the erection of a Dispensary Residence and Dispensary (with office) estimated to cost, according to the full details then submitted £385 and £180 respectively; £30 compensation to the tenant disturbed; £6 being a year's rent, and the balance £49 to cover Engineer's, &c. fees and contingencies. All the works then proposed, the Guardians reported complete when applying for balance of loan in November, 1890. In these circumstances it will be necessary for the Guardians to favour the Board with a statement showing clearly and in detail all the works in respect of which a supplemental loan of £300 is now sought.

on the occasion of his inspection of the Workhouse
on the 25th ultimo, from which it appears that the
financial position of the Union is unsatisfactory
the assets available being £1,205 and the
liabilities on the 29th instant being estimated at
£1,911, thus showing a balance against the Union
of £706 at the expiration of the financial year.
This condition of affairs must be held to be mainly
due to the action of the Guardians in reducing
last Autumn the poundage rate shown by the
estimate to be required. The dilatory manner,
however, in which Collector Bailey discharges
his duties does not tend to improve matters,
for out of £517 uncollected poor rate and £450
seed rate no less than £377 poor rate and £160
seed

seed rate is outstanding in his district not-
withstanding that the period for the completion
of the collection expired upon the 7th of June last.
The Inspector reports that with very little exertion
McBailey could have closed his collection within
the period allowed, and that it is well known
that rates are still due in his district by
well-to-do shopkeepers and others who would
no doubt have discharged their liability
long ago if the collector had pressed them to
do so. It further appears that although under
the terms of his appointment McBailey is not
entitled to receive his poundage fees until
the completion of his collection the
Guardians from time to time give him
large sums on account, and the Board
trust that this objectionable practice
will not be continued in future, and
that they will compel the Collector to
close his accounts satisfactorily without
further delay.

The Inspector in his report draws attention
to several matters (given in detail) and the
Board trust that ^{the} careful consideration of the
Guardians will be given to the several par-
ticulars referred to by the Inspector, and they
would at the same time suggest to the
Guardians the propriety of the Visiting Com-
