Adverting to previous correspondence on the subject of the proposal to erect a bridge in connection with the Intercepting Hospital for Cholera cases, and informing the Guardians that they have referred the plan and specification of the proposed work to their Chief Engineering Inspector, a copy of whose observations is annexed.

The legal difficulty alluded to in the Board's telegram of the 13th instant, to the Guardians had reference to the Guardians' power to erect this bridge, and the Board have been advised that they cannot do so without obtaining the authority of the Public Department having jurisdiction over the foreshore concerned.

The Board presume that pending the Guardians obtaining the necessary consent and the subsequent completion of the structure it will be in their power to make temporary arrangements for the transfer by boat or otherwise of patients who may require to be removed to the Cholera Hospital.

The plan and specification of the bridge returned, the Guardians beg to state that they can readily arrange for the transfer by boat of persons who may require to be removed to the Hospital.

amend the design and specification as suggested, that application be made to the Marine Department of the Board of Trade for sanction to the erection of the bridge. A map of the site and working drawings of the structure to accompany the application.

The Visiting Committee acting on the suggestion in the report of Major Puttidge-Jair, L.G. Inspector, visited the Workhouse on Friday last, and recommended as follows:—

That Blankets and Rugs as required be procured; that 20 Iron Bedsteads be substituted for the wooden Stretchers in Female Hospital Wards; that a small portion of the Female Yard be concreted; that a stove be placed in the Female Linnatic Ward; that a few window sashes in Hospital be repaired; that the drying Closet be put in order; that a portion of land on the farm be allotted for the use of the School Boys for instruction in agriculture; that some of the boys be sent to the workshops of the Workhouse Tailor and Shoemaker for instruction in these Trades. The Committee are of opinion that the floors in the Hospital are in fair condition; that the Gutters and downpipes are now in good order; that the Meat on the day of visiting was good, and the Bread was of fair quality.

The Committee are of opinion that there is no necessity to call upon the Workhouse Porter to resign as there are some years of work in him yet.
