28th May '94. From the Solicitor, informing the Guardians that he has made application to the Board of Guardians of the Port Union for the sum of £106.4.5 as directed by the Guardians at last meeting, and enclosing a reply which he received, in which the Clerk of the Port Union asked that the claim be not pressed until he has an opportunity of placing it before his Board at next meeting which will be on the 9th proximo.

The Solicitor requested to be informed whether he may allow the matter stand over till the 9th proximo as requested.
