

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland or others, relating to Sanitary Matters were read, and directions given thereon as follows:—

12th June '94, Letter from the Solicitor, enclosing a letter which he received from the Clerk of the Court-Union, in which the Guardians of that Union request the Solicitor not to proceed further in the matter of the claim re proportion of the cost of erecting a Cholera Intersecting Hospital at Galway, until they receive a reply from the Local Government Board to their proposal of the 23rd ultimo.

Order. The Solicitor to be directed to institute proceedings against the Guardians of the Court-Union for the recovery of the sum of £106. 4. 4 without further delay.

12th June '94, Letter from the Rev. J. Keane, P. O. Drummore, stating that he has been informed that the report re the overcrowding of persons in the cabin occupied by John Brennan at Drummore is to be under consideration of the Guardians again at meeting on the 13th instant. Informing the Guardians that this cabin deserves to be condemned in more respects than one as the female members of this family are of the most immoral character, a fact so publicly known that he will not enter into the particulars of the case at present.

12th June '94, From D. Kirwan, Medical Officer of Health for Drummore Dispensary District, informing the Guardians that John Brennan's house at Drummore is now in a perfectly sanitary condition as regards cleanliness, but there are still

still 8 persons living in an air space of 910 cubic feet, 1500 cubic feet being the space laid down for 5 persons, therefore the house is overcrowded.

Order John Brennan to be proceeded against as a defaulter under the Sanitary Acts.

slaughtered and the carcass buried.

The District Inspector R. G. Galway promised to
attend to the order of the Local Authority made
at last meeting re summoning an owner of
a dog found straying about not muzzled, as
a test case.
