Auditor's Memo.

"Pending the preparation of my detailed report on the Union I wish to call the attention of the Guardians to a practice in this Union which is not only irregular but absolutely illegal. It is the practice followed by the Relieving Officers of giving provisional relief continuously for long periods in cases which are admittedly neither sudden nor urgent—contrary to Section 7 of 10 Vic. C. 31, which provides that after making his report of the first week's relief to the Guardians the Relieving Officer shall give no further relief otherwise than by direction of the Guardians in the case so reported. All such relief if continued after the first week must be ordered in advance by the Guardians.

As regards the ordering of the continuance of such relief, I should like to remind the Guardians that they must be careful that the cases are such as to be eligible for out-door relief—for example in the cases of people having over 1/4 of an acre of land they can be relieved only by admission to the Workhouse, (see Section 2 of 25 & 26 Vic. C. 83.)

Many relief given in contravention of these enactments it will be my duty to surcharge the Relieving Officer if he acts without previous authority of the Guardians, and to surcharge the Guardian whose initials authorize the relief if it is given to a person not eligible under the statutes."

PROCEEDINGS of the BOARD of GUARDIANS acting as the BURIAL BOARD.

12th Nov. '94. Letter from Mr. J. J. Boghlan stating that in compliance with the request of the Guardians he has made an inspection of the drain passing through the old Cemetery at Rahoon. Having taken levels he finds there is a fall of nearly 18 inches between the flush on the road and the mouth of the Gullet near inside the gate of the Cemetery, and he is satisfied that, either there must be some obstruction on the covered portion of the drain under the road, or else the drain or sewer may be insufficient in size to carry off the water on times of heavy rain or floods. The covered portion is about 28 yards along the road. This must be opened and cleared, the result the open part through Mr. Griev's fields as well as the open part through the Cemetery will have to be cleared and deepened. The work can be done satisfactorily for from £40/- to £50/-. If the Board make an order that the work be carried out he shall see that it be done properly.

Order. Mr. Griev's letter complaining of the flooding of the roadway (entered on Minutes of 7th instant,) and Mr. Boghlan's report to be referred to the Town Commissioners with an intimation that the Guardians will be prepared to clear the portion of the drain passing through the Cemetery; that the Guardians consider it the duty of the Commissioners to remedy any defect in the drain under the public road, and of Mr. Griev's the portion situate in his fields.
