Report of out-door relief Committee.

Gentlemen,

Your Committee have gone over the Books of the several Relieving Officers of the Union and the out door relief lists, and we find that the variations in payments extending over a lengthened period does not exceed a few shillings, while some weeks the payments are less than the corresponding weeks of last year. In Swan Islands we find there is an increase of 9 cases and 14 persons in receipt of out-door relief this week compared with the corresponding week last year, which causes an increase in the outlay for the week of 14/6^d. In Spiddal District we find an increase of 5/- in the weekly payments. In Galway District we find there is only a difference of a few shillings extending over some weeks, less than the corresponding weeks of last year.

The increase in the out door relief extending over the entire Union has been caused by exceptional circumstances, such as the employment of a second Doctor in difficult cases, and of trained nurses when ordered by the Medical Officers.
