the Guardians adopted the unwise policy of
reducing the poundage rate which the Clerk showed
clearly in his estimate would be required to dis-
charge the ordinary liabilities of the Union.
There will be a balance of £750 against the Union
at the termination of the financial year which
expires on the 29th of September next, and it is to
be desired that when the next annual estimate
comes

comes before the Guardians for consideration
a rate will be made sufficient to place the Union
in a sound financial position. Collector Bailey
still continues to discharge his duties in an in-
efficient manner, rates to the amount of over £750
being still uncollected in his district, and it becomes
a matter for the Guardians to determine whether
at the close of his present collection they will retain
him any longer in his position. It appears the Porter
of the Workhouse is much too old and feeble to
discharge his duties satisfactorily and the Guardians
would do well to consider the propriety of granting
him a retiring allowance and obtaining the
services of a younger and more active man in
his place. The Porter of the Fever Hospital is
unable to discharge his duties efficiently owing
to old age and infirmity, and in this case also
the Guardians would require the services of
a more energetic officer. The Visiting Com-
-mittee appear to have met but twice during
the past half year, and the Board would impress
upon the Guardians the necessity of complying
with Article 59 of the Workhouse Rules on this
subject, inasmuch as the good management
of, and preservation of discipline in the estab-
-lishment, depend in a large measure on the
frequent and regular inspection of the insti-
-tution by a responsible Committee of the Guardians.
The report further goes into details of necessary
repairs, &c.
