Read Letter from L.G.B. 49722/94, dated 14th Dec^r 1894, stating that

referring to Minutes of the 5th instant, and requesting that the Guardians will be good enough to obtain a report from the Medical Officer of Health, temporarily in charge of the Furloughmore Dispensary District, giving particulars as to the number of cases of fever at present under treatment in the District and the measures being taken to prevent the further spread of the disease.

Report from Dr. M. F. Lyden.

Since my appointment to the Furloughmore District I have had only one case of fever (typhus) and the patient is now better. I went to see the Lavelle family whom Dr. Golding was attending for fever and they are all quite well. To prevent the further spread of the fever I have ordered the houses in which the fever was, to be thoroughly lime-washed, fumigated with sulphur, and the clothes, bed clothes, &c. to be boiled. To my knowledge there is not at present a case of fever

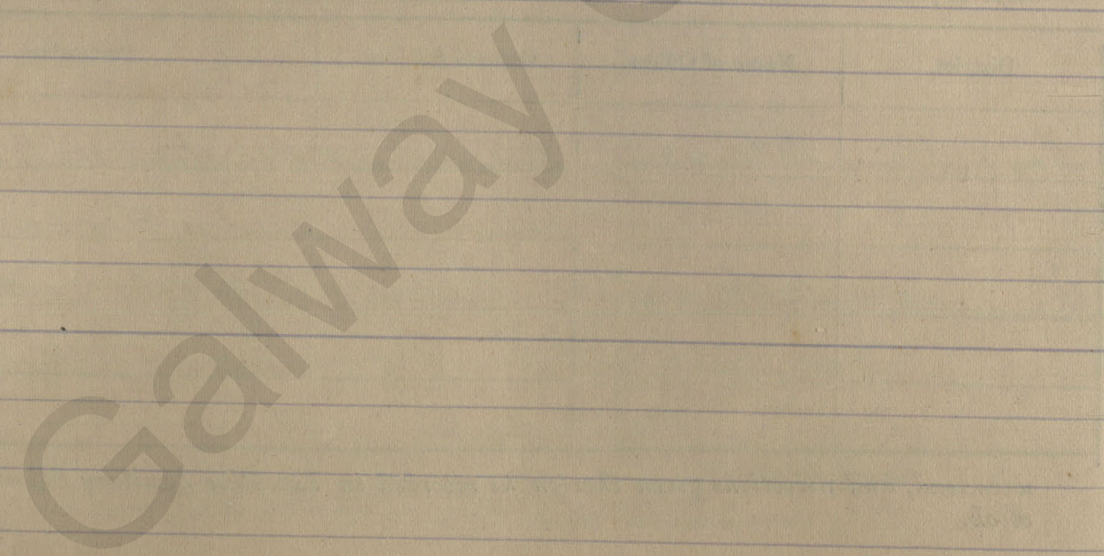

Received reports from the Constabulary of cases of supposed swine fever on the premises of Pat. Mahuty of Cornarona, Stephen Doherty, College Road, Galway, Michael Powell of Rossaveel, Pat. Kilkelly of Banna, and Mary Comor of Cloydagh.

The Veterinary Inspector furnished reports in these several cases: that except in the case of Michael Powell of Rossaveel, disease existed, and the animals were slaughtered, the carcasses buried, and the places were declared infected places.

16th Dec. 94. From the District Inspector, P. O. Galway, acknowledging receipt of Clerk's letter calling his attention to the nuisance caused by stray dogs in Galway and neighbourhood. Requesting to be informed whether the Regulations made by the local Authority on 29th February, 1888, have been varied or modified in any way.

Informed that the word "or" was substituted for "and" in Regulation No. 1. Copy of modified Regulations furnished.
