Burke it was unanimously Resolved - That as there are about 200 families in Aran Islands who are wholly destitute and totally unable to procure seed Potatoes or to get security for them, and whose land will be barren next year if not obtained at once; that we again call the attention of the h. L. B. to the report of Dr. Clements, their Inspector upon the destitution referred to, and to the several resolutions of the Guardians upon the same subject. The ratepayers on the Islands are wholly unable to bear the cost of seed Potatoes for those

in need of them, and as the season is now far advanced the Guardians are alarmed for the safety of the people for the next four months but especially for the means of their support next year as without getting assistance at once it will result in pauperising almost the whole people on the Islands.
