

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland or others relating to Sanitary Matters were read, and directions given thereon as follows:—

24<sup>th</sup> April, '95, From Mr. Perry, M. J. C. B.

"The correspondence and reports arising from my visit to the South and Middle Islands of Arran - by request of your Board - have been brought before the Congested Districts Board by Major Rutledge-Fair, Loc. Govt. Inspector.

The file has been sent to me by Major Rutledge-Fair. The minutes of the Congested Districts Board is as follows.

"Extract from Minutes of April 5<sup>th</sup> 1895."

"On consideration of the question of the water supply for the Middle and South Islands of Arran the Board sanctioned the payment of four-fifths of the necessary expenditure (not exceeding £250 in all) for providing an adequate supply of water provided the remainder of the necessary outlay be found locally, and that the works are carried out on plans approved by the Board and by the Local Government Board for Ireland."

Major Rutledge-Fair and myself take this to mean that the Board will give £250 if the work costs £312. 10. 0 in all (including Engineering expenses) or four-fifths of any lesser sum (than £312. 10. 0). My estimate of the work was £300. In this view the Islanders are asked to contribute a sum not exceeding £62. 10. 0 for a water supply which will cost £312. 10. 0.

I am asked by Major Rutledge-Fair to bring this offer before the Board and as the Board

Board have employed me to act for them in this matter I would strongly recommend them to accept the offer of the Congested Districts Board with thanks.

On the motion of Mr. P. Burke, seconded by Mr. H. Mac Donnell, it was unanimously Resolved. That the Congested Districts Board be informed that we accept their offer with grateful thanks.

### Report of Stock-taking and Visiting Committee.

We have taken stock of the Clothing and Bedding and have found them correct. The articles mentioned in detail in the Clothing Receipt-Book to which we have signed our names have been cancelled from the stock by us. We find the Male Wards in Hospital still without female helpers, and the Master assured us there are no suitable persons in the house to act as such. We ask the Guardians to take this subject into consideration, and recommend that the Porters' room be put in proper order, and that a dozen cloaks be provided for the schoolgirls.

We beg to state that the order and cleanliness of the house and hospitals reflect credit on the Officers in charge, and that there is a marked improvement



improvement in the appearance of the School boys."
