The Guardians did everything in their power to  
put the Seed Supply Act in operation in Aran  
Islands. The usual notices were put up by the  
Relieving Officer inviting persons to apply for  
seed, and all the applicants who were rated  
at not more than £15 were supplied. Upwards  
of 80 persons who were not rated applied and  
they



they were informed that under the Act the Guardians could not supply them with seed, as their names did not appear on the Rate Books, until they got security. They stated they could not get security and if they did not get the seed as a free grant they would not have them at all. The Guardians were powerless in the matter, although most anxious to relieve those poor helpless people, and by resolution over and over again this was explained to the local Government Board. Mr. Clements, loc. Govt. Inspector reported to the Board that there were a number of persons in the Aran Islands in a very poor condition and that the people who required seed most were in the position of squatters. It is not accurate to state that the potato crop in Aran last season was satisfactory, and it is also untrue to say that large quantities of potatoes were sold off the Islands and exported to the mainland. From most reliable information given to the Guardians by their Relieving Officer it appears that only one person in Aran Island sold any potatoes exported to the mainland, and the quantity sold would be only four or five loads. If the Government try to shift the responsibility for supplying seed to the people of Aran to the Guardians who are powerless to do so, they will be evading their plain and simple duty, and they must be prepared to accept the responsibility and the consequences however disastrous they may be to those poor destitute people. It is only by a free grant of seed those people can be relieved and the Government should provide the necessary funds

funds to supply them or start some relief works to give employment to the people during the summer. That copies of this resolution be sent to the Chief Secretary, Mr. Sheehy and Mr. Pinkerton, and that Mr. Sheehy be asked to call the attention of the Chief Secretary to his reply given in the House of Commons upon this question.
