24<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup>. } Informing the Guardians that Her Majesty's Government have had under consideration the important question of providing in certain cases a supply of seed potatoes for occupiers and cultivators of land in Electoral Divisions where they may be unable through poverty, and in consequence of the failure of the potato crop this year, to procure a supply for themselves. Meanwhile to prevent delay the Government are prepared to advance money without interest to Guardians for the purchase of seed potatoes, to be sold to occupiers or cultivators of land valued at not more than £15 in any Electoral Division in which the Guardians believe that such persons are generally unable ~~through poverty~~ to procure an adequate supply of seed potatoes.

Also forwarding Rules to be observed by Boards of Guardians in carrying into effect the provisions of this Circular Letter.
