"That, We the Board of Town Commissioners, in Meeting assembled, express our dissatisfaction with, and disapproval of, the present state of the law on the subject of ground rents, which throw the entire burden of Taxation on the owner or occupier of property, and allows the ground landlord, who draws from one-fourth to one-seventh of the entire valuation in the shape of ground rent, to go "scott free."
