On the motion of Mr. M. J. Morris, seconded by Mr. D. Redington, it was unanimously Resolved. that we affirm our resolution of the 13th January, 1892, in respect to the letter of the Board of Works, its complaints of the sewerage have been made except by Board of Admiralty, and that because the drain runs through land acquired by them, although it has so run from time immemorial. We therefore decline to relieve the Admiralty from an inconvenience at the expense solely of the struggling ratepayers of a locality scheduled within the area of the congested Districts Board.
