Sir,

The Poor Law Commissioners have received a report from Mr Burke, Assistant Commissioner relative to the state of the Louth Union from which it appears that the Board of Guardians are desirous of deferring for some time longer the period at which relief shall be afforded in the Work House and the Commissioners perceive by a Resolution passed by the Board on the 10th Instant that their meeting has been adjourned for a month; and in reference thereto I am directed to point out that the Work House being declared by the Commissioners it became the duty of the Board of Guardians to meet once at the least in every week, in compliance with the regulations framed for their guidance Section II paragraph 4, and the Commissioners request therefore that the regulation may at once be complied with, as the Guardians are bound forthwith to take the necessary steps

to discharge the debts incurred by the Union, even if the Relief of the destitute Poor in the Work House be still further delayed, and the Commissioners request that an receipt of this Letter you will accordingly call a Special Meeting of the Board of Guardians to take the matter again into consideration.
